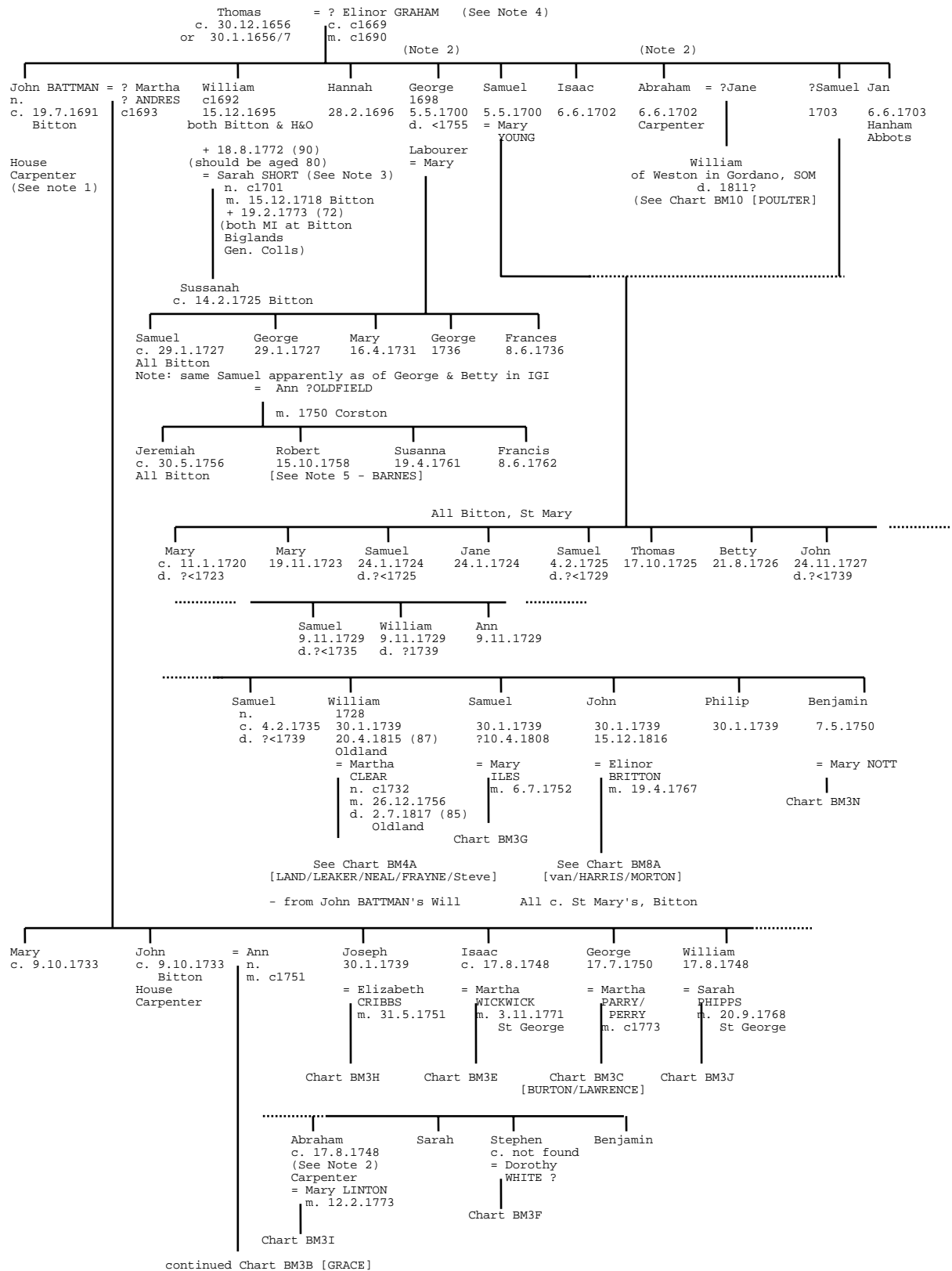

Note 1: Will of John BATTMAN (14.2.1766)

In the name of God Amen. I John BATTMAN of the hamlett of Oldland in the parish of Bitton and County of Gloucester House Carpenter being very weak in body but of perfect mind and memory. Thanks be to God do make and ordain this my last will and testament in form and manner following. First I give and bequeath to Isaac and George my well beloved sons all that cottage garden and enclosure of ground thereunto belonging containing by estimate an acre of ground (more or less) lying and situate upon Drawn Hill Also I give to my beloved sons William Abraham and John found pounds and ten shillings each lawful money of England to be raised and levied out of the said cottage and enclosure of ground in the manner following (viz) that my said two sons Isaac and George shall pay or cause to be paid unto my beloved son William two pounds and five shillings the first year and two pounds five shillings the year following my decease and ten shillings per annum each unto my beloved sons John and Abraham till the payment of four pounds ten shillings each is completed Also I give to my dearly beloved daughters Mary and Sarah all that enclosure of ground lying westward of William SPICERS in Woodstock containing by estimation an acre of ground (more or less) and that my said daughters shall pay or cause to be paid unto my beloved son Joseph fifteen shillings per year untill the payment of five pounds is completed Likewise fifteen shillings per year unto my beloved son Steven untill payment of four pounds ten shillings is completed Also I give to my beloved son Benjamin all that enclosure of ground adjoining the above mentioned in Woodstock containing by estimation a half acre of ground (more or less) and likewise constitute make and ordain my beloved sons Benjamin and Joseph sole executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke disannull all and every other former testaments and wills legacies bequests ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal fourteenth day of February in the sixth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third King of Great Britten France and Ireland etc. and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty six Signed sealed and declared as my last will and testament in the presence of us Amy ROGERS, Emanuel MORTON

Probate Granted 14th day of October 1766
The within named Benjamin BATTMAN son and one of the executors was duly sworn before me Wm HUGHES Sol.

This will was proved the 14th day of October in the year of our Lord 1766 before the worshipful James BENSON Doctor of Law vicar general in spirituals of the Right Reverend Father in God William by Divine Lord Bishop of the diocese of Gloucester and his episcopal consistory official principal lawfully constituted by Benjamin BATTMAN son and one of the executors etc. to whom etc. having first sworn . . . and faithfully to administer to the said will and also to exhibit an inventory and render an account etc.

Note 2: Administration of George BATTMAN's Estate

14th day of October 1755

On which day appeared personally Abraham BATTMAN and alleged that George BATTMAN late of Bitton in the diocese of Gloucester labourer died intestate and that he the said Abraham BATTMAN is the lawful and natural brother of the deceased. Wherefore he prayed that administration of all and singular the goods and chattells rights and credits of the said deceased might be granted and committed to him on giving such good and sufficient security as is in this behalf is required and so forth.

Let administrations be granted as above prayed etc.

W. HUGHES

Know all men by these present, that we Abraham BATTMAN of the parish of Walton in the county of Somerset Carpenter and William BATTMAN of the parish of Bitton in the county of Gloucester Carpenter are held, and firmly bound unto James Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Gloucester in two hundred pounds of good lawful money of Great Britainetc. etc."

[Remainder of form is pre-printed binding Abraham to deliver the letters of administration etc. Both Abraham and William signed the form.]

Note 3: A C18th Funeral at Bitton

Extracted from B&AFHS article by John GOULSTONE:

Joannah FLOWER, spinster of Upton Cheney died on 23rd January 1752 and was buried at Bitton on the 29th. Two days before her death she had drawn up her will. It made rather elaborate and precise arrangements for her funeral, with a total sum allocated of £60.

Sarah BATMAN and three other women were left £5 and a pair of gloves each, and desired to lay her out. Sarah was also to buy hat-bands and gloves for the chief mourners, and the shroud "as good a one as will not cost less than £3 with the winding sheet and pillow". Sarah's husband William BATMAN, presumably a carpenter, was asked to make the same sort of coffin as he made for Joannah's sister Elizabeth, who died in 1744. William was named along with three other men as one of her underbearers. All were to be supplied with gloves and hat-bands.

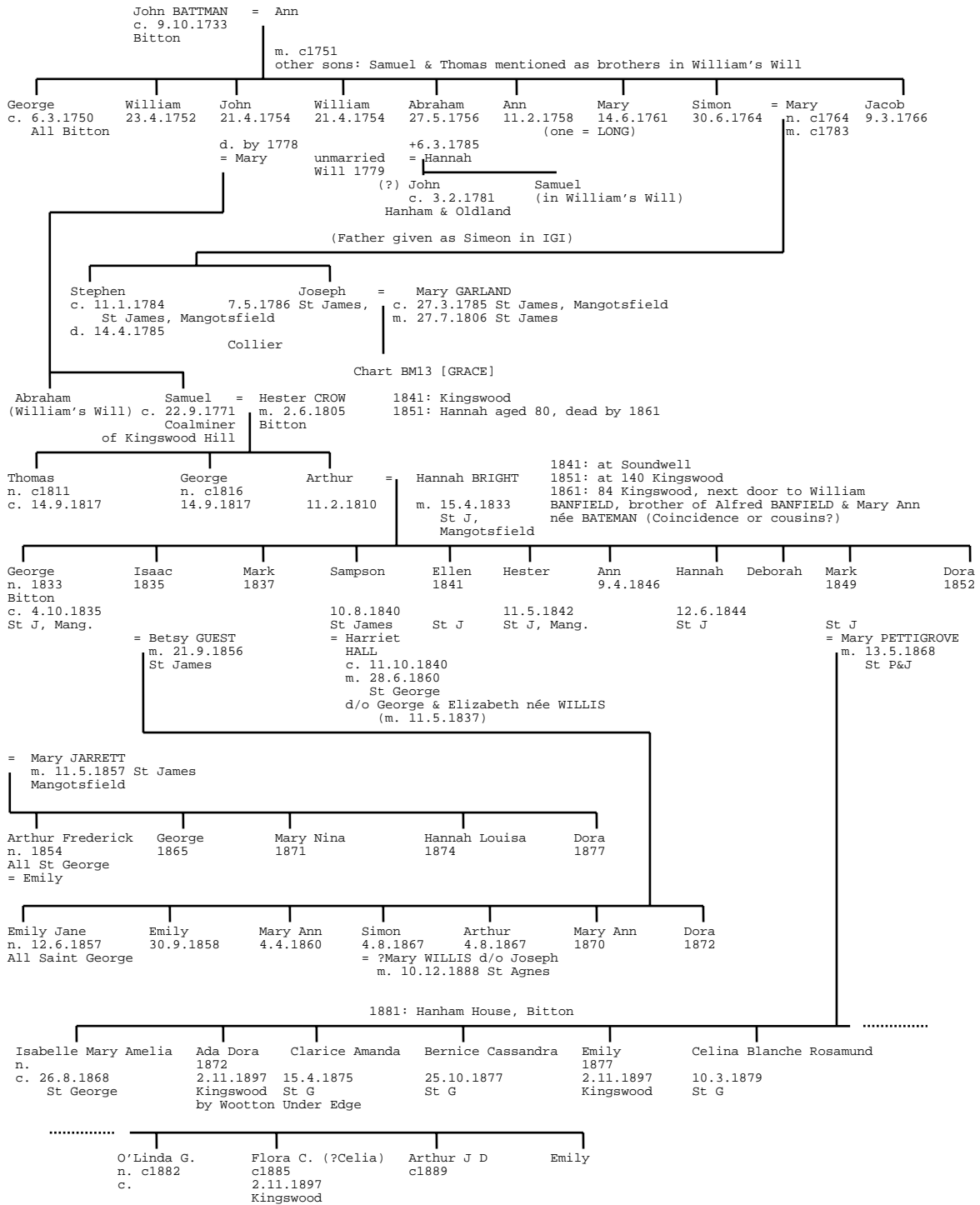

Elizabeth BATEMAN (described as of Asthall, Oxon.) married Robert LUNN of Cleeve Prior on 9/06/1830. Pam's mother was a LUNN in direct descent from this couple via their son Rev John Robert LUNN and grandson Dr Cyril Reginald LUNN.

- 1) CHARLES BATEMAN, unmarried.
- 2) ROBERT BATEMAN, twin of Frances Bateman (below), married Miss CLARIDGE, no issue. He was a doctor at Bengeworth, a pupil of Dr Abernethy, and died of blood poisoning.
- 3) FRANCES BATEMAN, twin of Robert Bateman (above), married at Cheltenham JOSEPH THOMAS.
- 4) ELIZABETH BATEMAN of Asthall, Oxon., married 9th June 1830 ROBERT LUNN of Cleeve Prior and Edgbaston. She died of pleurisy 1st August 1852; he died of bladder trouble 7th July 1876.
- 5) RACHEL BATEMAN married JOHN LOVETT at Gloucester. "He saw her walking in Northgate Street & never rested till he found out who she was, and married her."
One of their daughters SARAH LOVETT married ARTHUR BATEMAN (below).
- 6) HENRY BATEMAN married MARY WESTALL "a very fine looking woman", daughter of a lawyer.
 - (a) EMILY BATEMAN married JOHN COLLYER; no issue.
 - (b) ARTHUR BATEMAN married SARAH LOVETT; lived at Asthally near Witney; they had issue :-
 - (i) ARTHUR BATEMAN married Miss CRISP; no issue.
 - (c) ELLEN BATEMAN, died aged four.
- 7) WILLIAM BATEMAN was "engaged to a Miss Chandler (clever musician & painter), treated her badly & she committed suicide & he never prospered after"; married firstly Miss JAMES of Brighton, known as "the belle of Brighton" and had issue :-
 - (a) JULIA FRANCIS HANNAH BATEMAN "a bad lot, ran off with married schoolmaster".
William married secondly, ROSANNAH PRATT and had issue :-
 - (b) ROSANNAH PRATT BATEMAN; ran off with a married man.
 - (c) ELIZABETH BATEMAN.

WILL OF WILLIAM BATMAN OF WICK & ABSON, Husbandman (15.11.1778 - proved 30.10.1779)

In the name of God Amen. I WILLIAM BATMAN of the parish of Wick and Abson in the county of Gloucester husbandman being weak in body but of a sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do this fifteenth day of November in the year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy eight make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say.

First I give and bequeath unto my brother Abraham BATMAN all that my two little tenements together with the garden thereto belonging situate standing and being in the parish of Bitton in the county of Gloucester for and during the term of his natural life and from and after his decease I give the same two little freehold tenements and premises unto Samuel BATMAN son of the said brother Abraham BATMAN and to his heirs and assigns for ever.

Also I give unto my said brother Abraham BATMAN the sum of ten pounds.

Also I give unto my brothers Samuel BATMAN and Thomas BATMAN ten pounds each in cash.

Also I give unto my brother George BATMAN the sum of five pounds.

Also I give unto my kinsman Abraham BATMAN son of my late brother John BATMAN deceased the sum of five pounds.

Also I give unto my two late fellow servants Thomas CADWELL and Dianna SUTTON three pounds each.

Also I give unto my friend and neighbour Henry HATHWAY the sum of five pounds. Also I give unto Phoebe HATHWAY daughter of the said Henry HATHWAY five pounds in money.

Also I give unto John LONG, Betty LONG, Jane LONG, William LONG, Sarah LONG, James LONG, Joseph LONG and Hannah LONG sons and daughters of my brother in law William LONG five pounds each in cash

and my will is that all my wearing apparel both linen and woollen shall be equally divided between my four brothers namely Samuel BATMAN, George BATMAN, Thomas BATMAN and Abraham BATMAN share and share alike.

And my further will is that all the before mentioned legacies shall be paid by my executor hereunder named in one year next after my decease. All the rest and residue of my monies goods chattels and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever my debts and funeral expenses first being paid and discharged. I give unto my brother in law William LONG whom I make whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

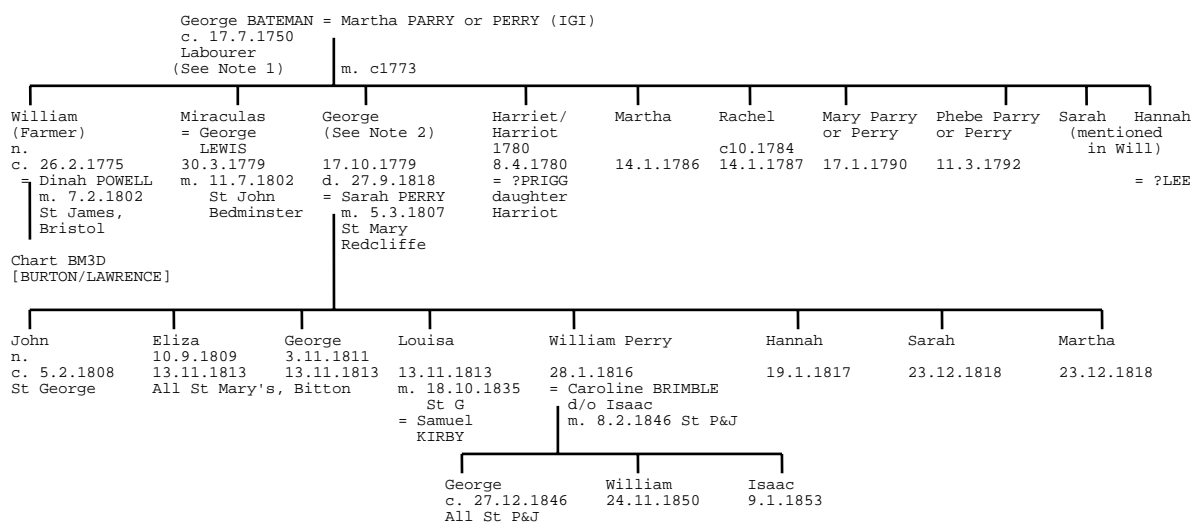

Note 1: Will of George BATMAN, the Father (9/6/1806)

In the name of God, Amen, I Geo. BATMAN of the parish of Bitton in the County of Gloucestershire being mindful of my mortality do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following:
 First I give and devise unto my wife Martha BATMAN all that messuage or tenement with the land adjoining situate in the Hamlet of Oldland in the aforesaid Parish of Bitton with all my stock of cattle implements of husbandry dayry utensels furniture &c during the term of her natural life, after her decease to be equally divided between Phoebe, Sarah, Martha and Ratchel BATMAN daughter of me Geo. BATMAN by paying out of the above legacy to Hannah LEE daughter of me Geo. BATMAN the sum of thirty pounds, of lawful money of Great Brittain. Also to Harriot PRIGG daughter as aforesaid the sum of twenty pounds, but if the said Harriot PRIGG and her daughter Harriot should happen to dye before the aforesaid Martha BATMAN the aforesaid twenty pounds to be equally divided between Phoebe and Sarah BATMAN share and share alike Also I give to my daughter Miraculus LEWIS the sum of one shilling all the rest and residue of my personal estate whatsoever an wheresoever and what nature kind and quality soever the same may be and not before given and disposed of after the paymt. of my debts and funeral exps. I do hereby give unto my wife Martha BATMAN for and during the term of her natural life.
 Lastly I constitute and appoint my son Geo. BATMAN with Phoebe BATMAN my daughter to be Excr. and Executrix of the my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of June one thousand eight hundred and six.

Note 2: Will of George BATMAN, the Son (10/6/1818)

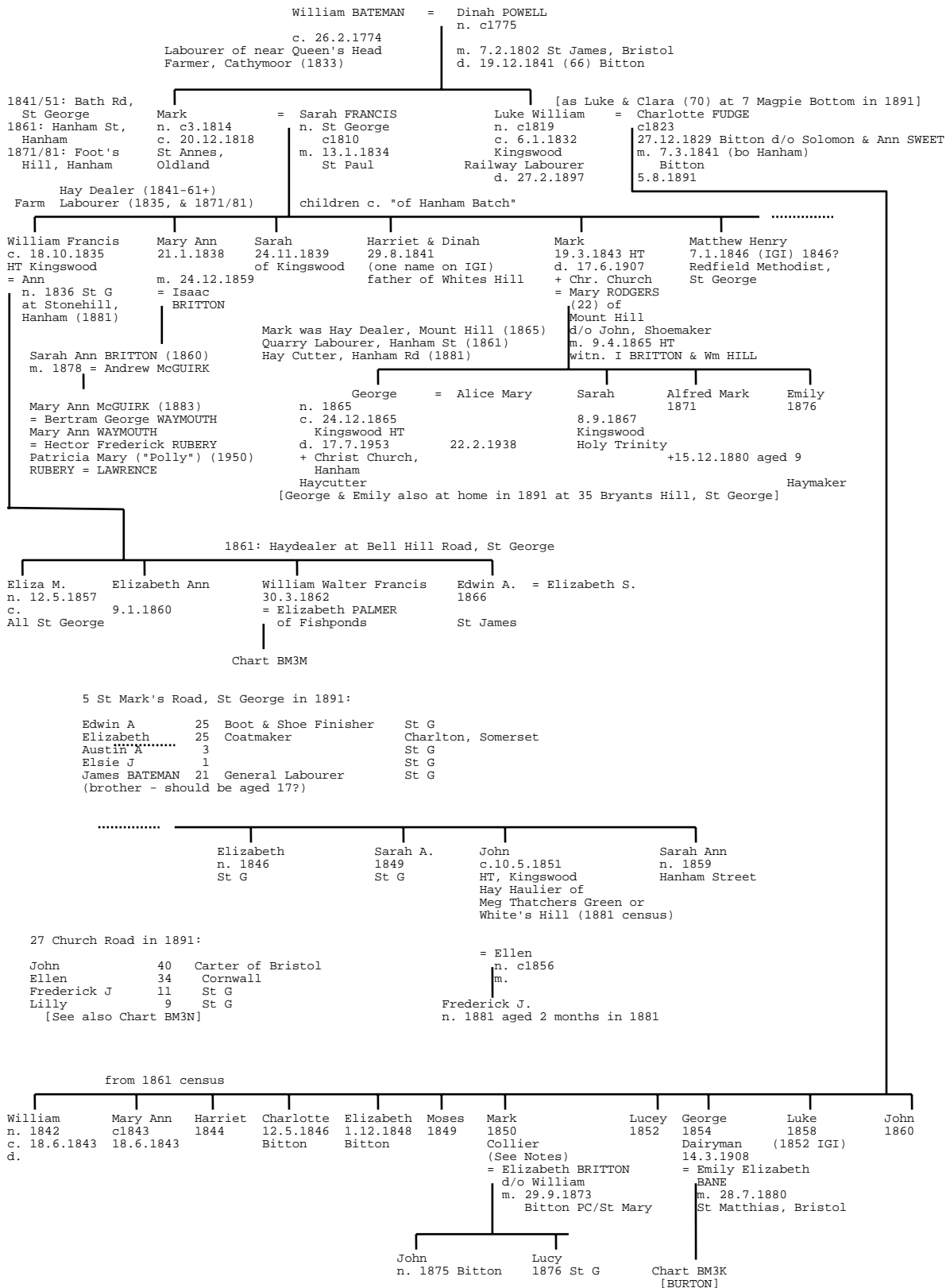
This is the last Will and Testament of me George BATMAN of Upton in the parish of Bitton in the County of Gloucester, yeoman, made this tenth day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighteen, being, though weak in Body, of sound and disposing Mind Memory and Understanding. Thanks be to almighty God for the same. First I commend my Soul to God, and committ my Body to the earth to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors herein after named; and as for my Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased Almighty God to bless me. I give and dispose thereof as follows (that is to say) It is my Will and desire, and I hereby give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Sarah BATMAN and her assigns, during the Term of her natural Life (provided she shall so long continue my Widow and be unmarried, but not otherwise) my two Houses or Tenements with a Barn and Garden and Appurtenances thereunto belonging, and also Eight Plots or Pieces of Land, all situate in this Parish, and after her Decease, or the Determination of her Widowhood as aforesaid, I give devise and bequeath to my son George BATMAN one of the said Houses or Tenements with the Garden and Barton, and also two of the said Plots or Pieces of Lands called Butterwells; and to my son William BATMAN I give devise and bequeath the other House or Tenement with the Barn and also three Plots or Pieces of Land, called the Upper Tithings. To my daughter Louisa BATMAN I give devise and bequeath a Plot or Piece of land called Bartons; to my daughter Eliza BATMAN I give devise and bequeath a Plot or Piece of Land called Keene Moor in the said Parish and another Piece of Land called Half Acre. I also give and bequeath to my said wife Sarah BATMAN, and her assigns, all my Stock, Goods, Chattels and Household Furniture of every kind, to be at her and their Disposal and for her use and benefit. And it is my Will and desire that in case either of my aforesaid Children should die before being in possession of their Property such Property shall become the Survivors, Share and share alike. And all the Rest, Residue and Remainder of my estate whatsoever an wheresoever I give and bequeath the same, and every part thereof unto my said wife Sarah BATMAN. And I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my said Wife Sarah BATMAN and John LEE, Carpenter of Bath, joint Executrix and Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the date above written.

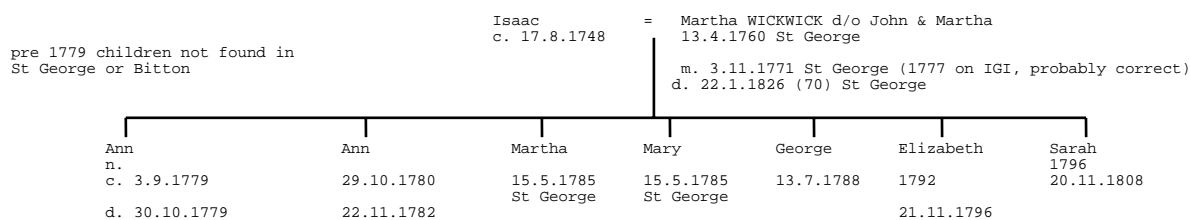

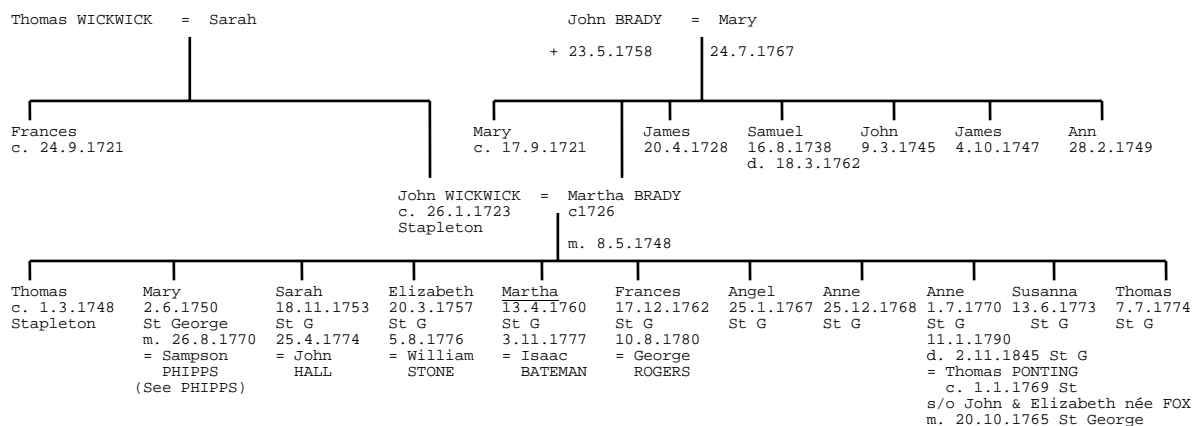
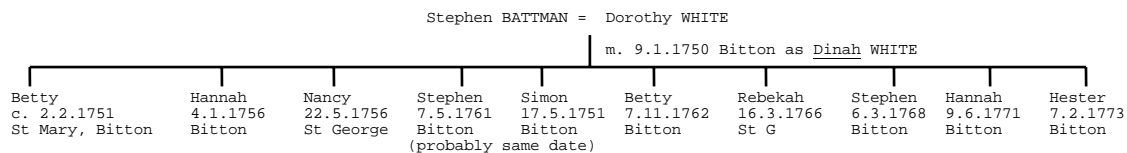

Note 1: Will of Stephen BATMAN, Carpenter of Mangotsfield (24/2/1785)

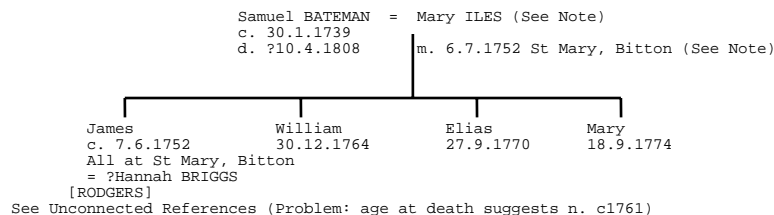
In the name of God, Amen. The twenty fourth day of February One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-five. I Stephen BATMAN of the parish of Mangotsfield in the County of Gloucester Carpenter, being sick and weak in body, but of perfect Mind and Memory, thank be given to God. Therefore calling to mind the mortality of my Body, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament; that is to say, principally and first of all, I commend my Soul unto the hands of God that give it and my Body to the earth. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First, I give and bequeath to Dorothy my wife, all singular my lands, tenements or houses; goods and all my rights claim and demands whatsoever to be freely possessed and enjoyed by her and even by her to be sold for subsistence if necessity constrain her thereto; (and if not) during all the term of her natural life, and at her decease I give and bequeath the same (if necessity has not constrained her to sell it) as follows. To my son Simon or to his surviving children I give my dwelling house with the appurtenances thereunto belonging together with the back garden, and patch of ground before the door, to be freely entered upon, possessed and enjoyed by him or them from and after the decease of my wife, Provided nevertheless that he or they shall pay out of the same the sum of five pounds of good and lawful money unto my daughter Dinah immediately upon his or their taking possession of the same which sum of five pounds I give and bequeath to my daughter Dinah afore named to be levied by her out of the said premises; provided also that my son Simon or any of his children shall outlive my wife, but if he dies before my wife leaving no surviving child then in that case the said premises I also give to my wife to leave to whom she pleases, reserving nevertheless that the five pounds for my daughter Dinah to be paid to her out of the same as aforesaid. Unto my son in law William MAGGS, I give the piece of ground next the road commonly called the Little Patch, to be entered upon and possessed and enjoyed by him and his children from and after my wife's decease. And what furniture goods utensils wearing apparel and moveables shall be at my wife's decease I give and bequeath to my children namely Dinah, Nancy, Simon and Betty to be equally shared amongst them. And I do hereby constitute make and ordain my wife my sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannull, all and every for Testaments, Wills, Legacies and Bequests and Executors by me in any ways before named willed and bequested; ratifying and confirming this, and no other, to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

Memorandum

I have here above given Nancy my daughter only share in my moveables as above, because I had given her and her husband in my lifetime the ground wherein their house stands and the patch of ground by the pitt.

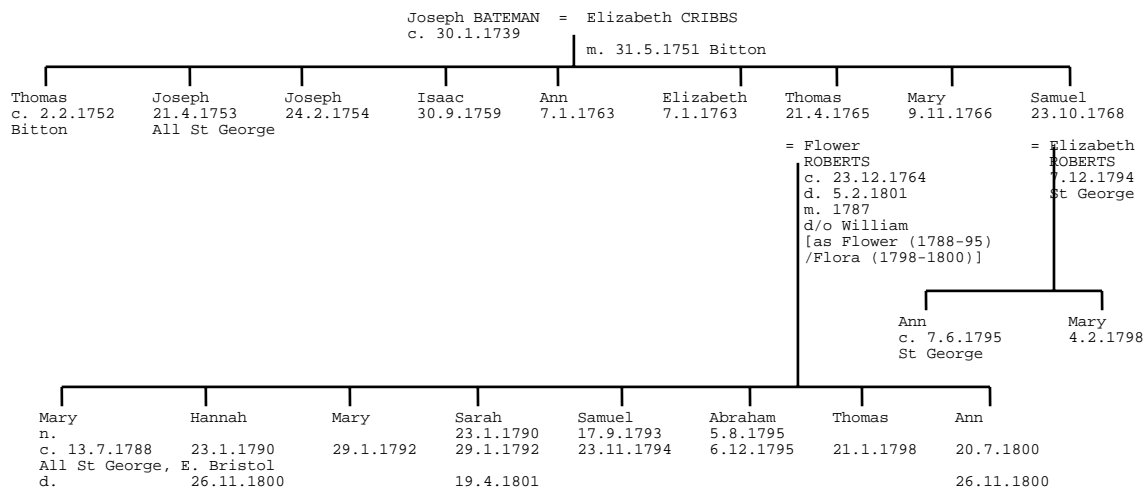
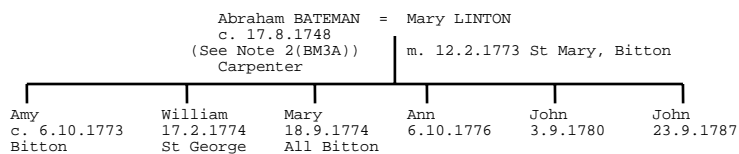


CHART BM3I: Descendants of Abraham BATEMAN & Mary LINTON

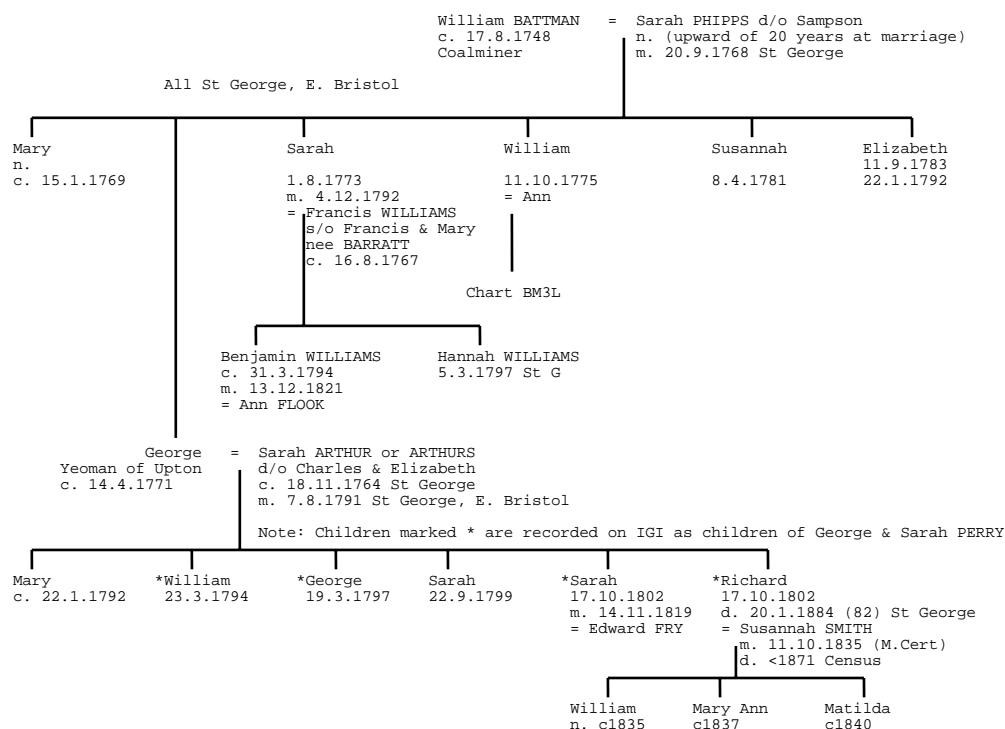

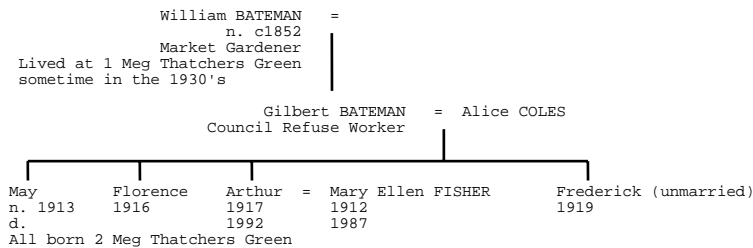
Situated about 4 miles from the centre of Bristol between Two Mile Hill (Old London Road) and Hanham Road (Old Bath Road). In 1995 there are 6 cottages remaining, nos. 1-4 in a terraced rank, and 8 & 9 as a detached pair. Stone built around 1780, most were demolished in 1920. Researcher Terry POOLE (Chart BM12) purchased no. 1 in 1958, in a bad state of repair, from Herbert & Stanley THATCHER, trustees of William THATCHER.

Until about 1920 there was a stone quarry close by and the cottages were built for the workers. Megan THATCHER was the wife of the owner.

The area remained a beautiful countryside lane until in 1970 the council built on derelict land and put a new road through.

In 1958, an Arthur BATEMAN, his wife Mary and his brother Frederick BATEMAN occupied no. 2. Frederick is still resident in 1995.

Note on Rev. Robert James BATEMAN by Ronald Raymond M. BATEMAN

Robert James Bateman (Ron's grandfather's brother, referred to in the letter as Uncle Bob))

Dr. Robert James Bateman built a mission in Jacksonville, and ran it for down and outs. He stayed with Ron's grandfather when he visited the UK from the States, and he returned on the Titanic with his sister-in-law Ada BALLS. Ron believes his grandfather helped build the mission, as his grandfather went to the US seven times during his life.

Robert James Bateman led some passengers in prayers and conducted the band in playing Nearer My God To Thee (his favourite hymn). Mentioned in the book and subsequent film A Night To Remember. The recent James CAMERON film has a similar scene, although the characters are not identified. He was washed over-board and drowned 15 April 1912.

The funeral (Jacksonville, Florida) was described as being like a State Funeral.

Over the years many articles have been written about "Uncle Bob", including a large article last year in the Bristol Evening Post. Ron's son Steve, when last in the States, went to Jacksonville, and obtained copies of the papers at the time of the Titanic.

Ron says "Uncle Bob" had 6 children. He was also a Knight's Templar.

Tom Bateman (Ron's father)

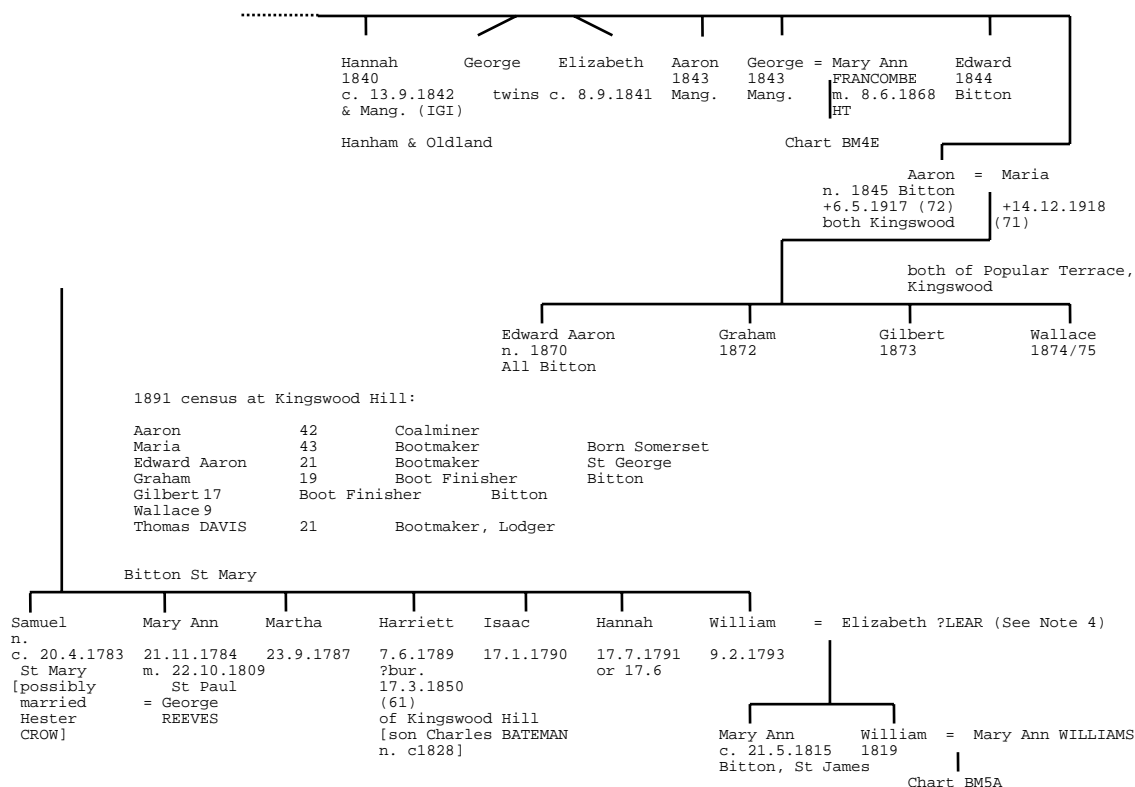
While he was in the UK, he had asked Ron's grandfather whether he could take Ron's father back with him. As it transpired, Ron's grandmother wisely would not let him go.

Tom married Emma COOK. Tom fought in France in the 1914-18 war, and fought in some of the famous battles. He survived, although he was wounded.

William Robert Bateman (Ron's uncle. Tom's brother)

Also fought in France in the 1914-18 war, but was killed at Passendale in 1917. Apparently details of where he is buried are on the Internet.

This is the last Will and Testament of me William BATEMAN of the parish of Bitton in the County of Gloucester Carpenter made this seventeenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten as follows, that is to say, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha BATEMAN all and singular my Freehold and Leasehold messuages lands and tenements and hereditaments and also all other my personal estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever of what nature or kind soever to hold the same unto my said wife and her assigns for and during the term of her natural life and from and after her decease as touching and concerning five sixth part of shares of my said freehold and leasehold messuages lands tenements and hereditaments and all other my said personal estate the whole to be considered as divided into six equal parts or shares to the use of my sons George, Aaron, and Moses and my daughters Hannah the wife of George HALE of the City of Bristol Shopkeeper and Mary the wife of Isaac JOHNSON of the said parish of Bitton Coalminer their heirs executors administrators and assigns for all my Estate and interest therein then to come in equal shares as tenants in Common and not as joint tenants And touching and concerning the remaining one sixth part or share of my said real and personal estate and effects to the use of all and every the children and child of my late deceased son Solomon BATEMAN which may be living at the time of the decease of my said wife then his or her heirs executors administrators and assigns for all the remainder of my estate terms and interest therein then to come in equal shares if more than one as tenants in common and not as joint tenants Subject nevertheless and I do hereby charge and make chargeable my real and personal estate (after the decease of my said wife) with the payment of three pounds of lawful money to my grandson Charles BATEMAN son of my late deceased son Nathan BATEMAN in case he shall happen to survive my said wife and attain the age of twenty one years and do hereby appoint my said wife sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills by me at anytime heretofore made In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and Seal the day and year first above written.

Mary Ann the wife of the said George REEVES and also with the payment of the sum of fifteen pounds sterling to my son William BATEMAN their respective executors administrators and assigns and also of interest for both the same sums at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum to be computed and paid from and after the expiration of six calendar months next after my decease until the said principal sums shall be respectively discharged) In trust to permit her my said daughter Harriet to occupy the said premises during her life but in case she shall not choose so to do then in trust to 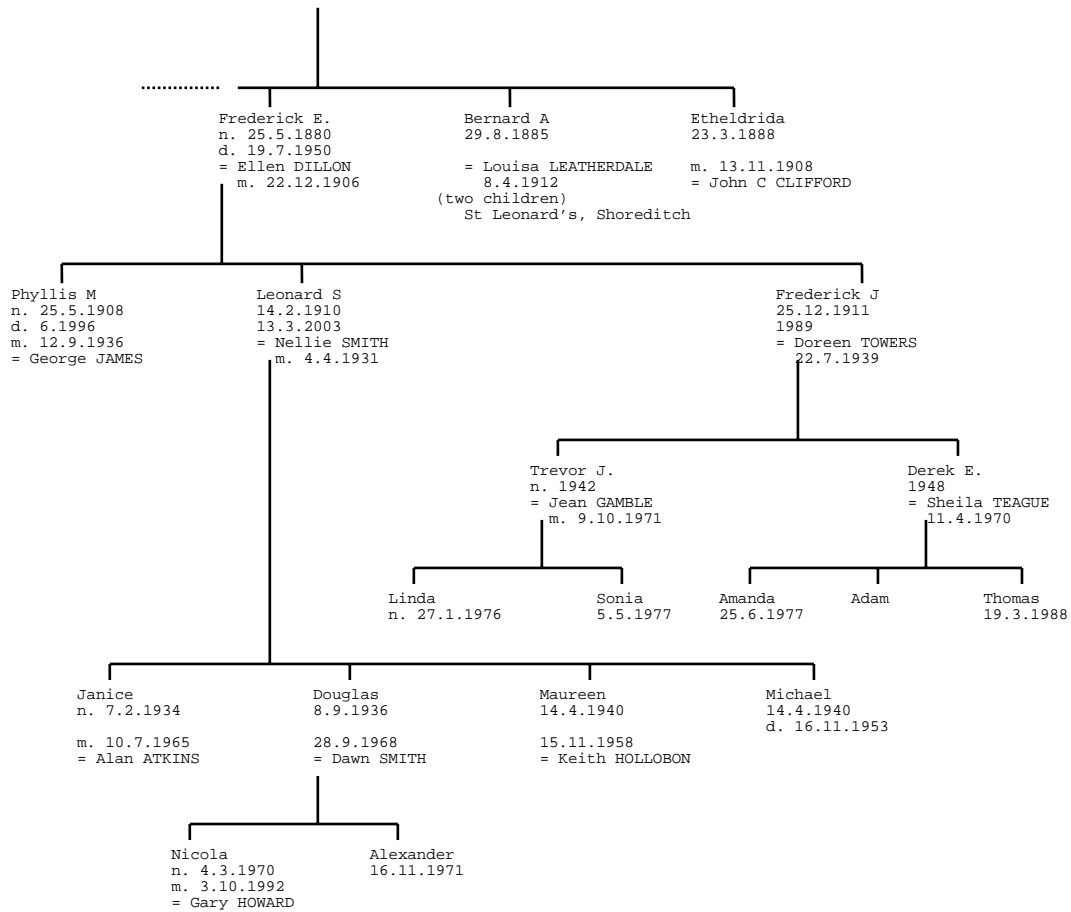
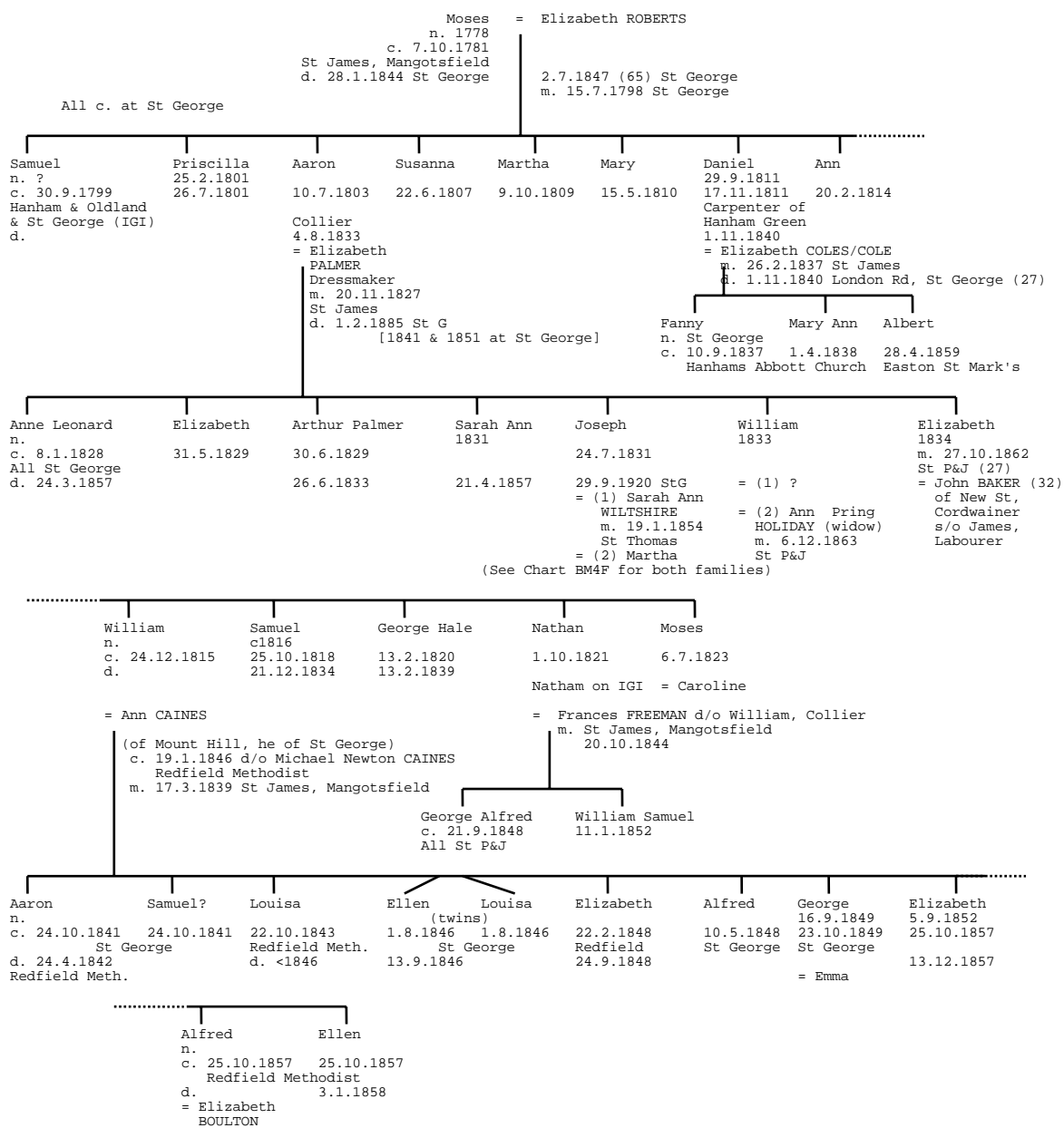


CHART BM4C: Descendants of Moses BATEMAN & Elizabeth ROBERTS of St George [LEAKER / NEAL / FRAYNE]

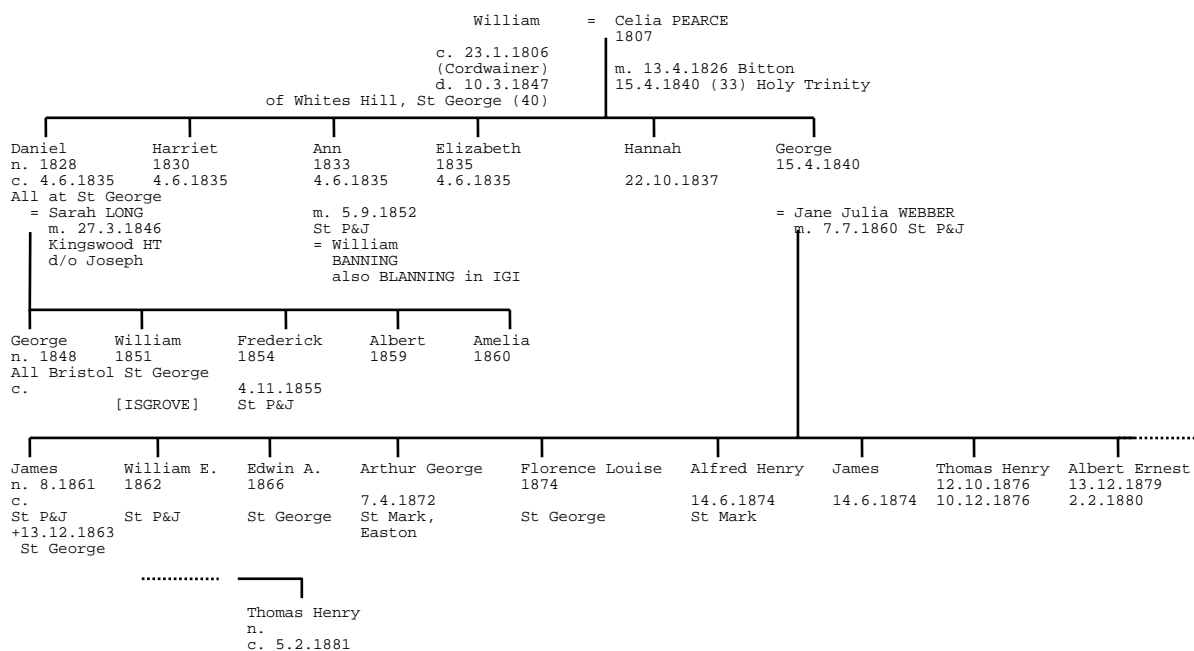

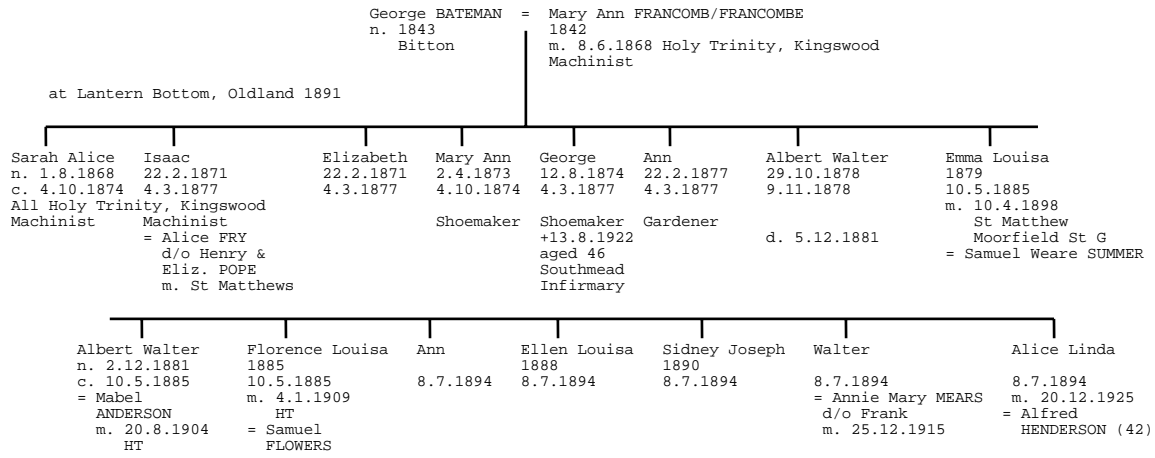


CHART BM4F: Descendants of Joseph BATEMAN & Marriages to Sarah Ann WILTSHIRE & Martha FLOOK

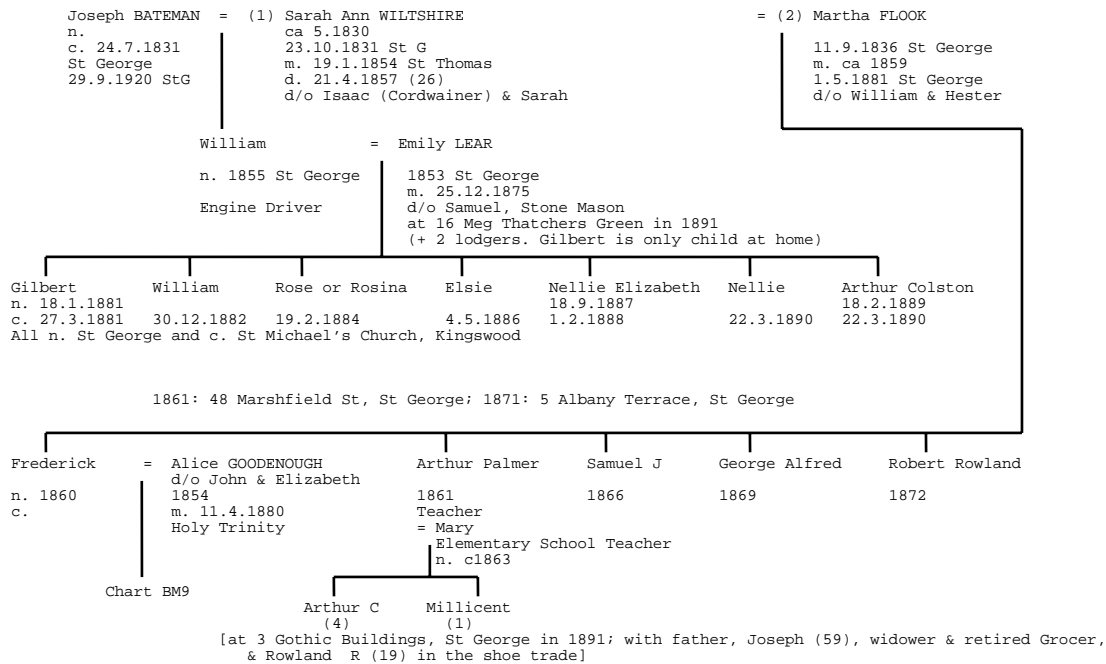


CHART BM4G: Descendants of James BATEMAN & Ann

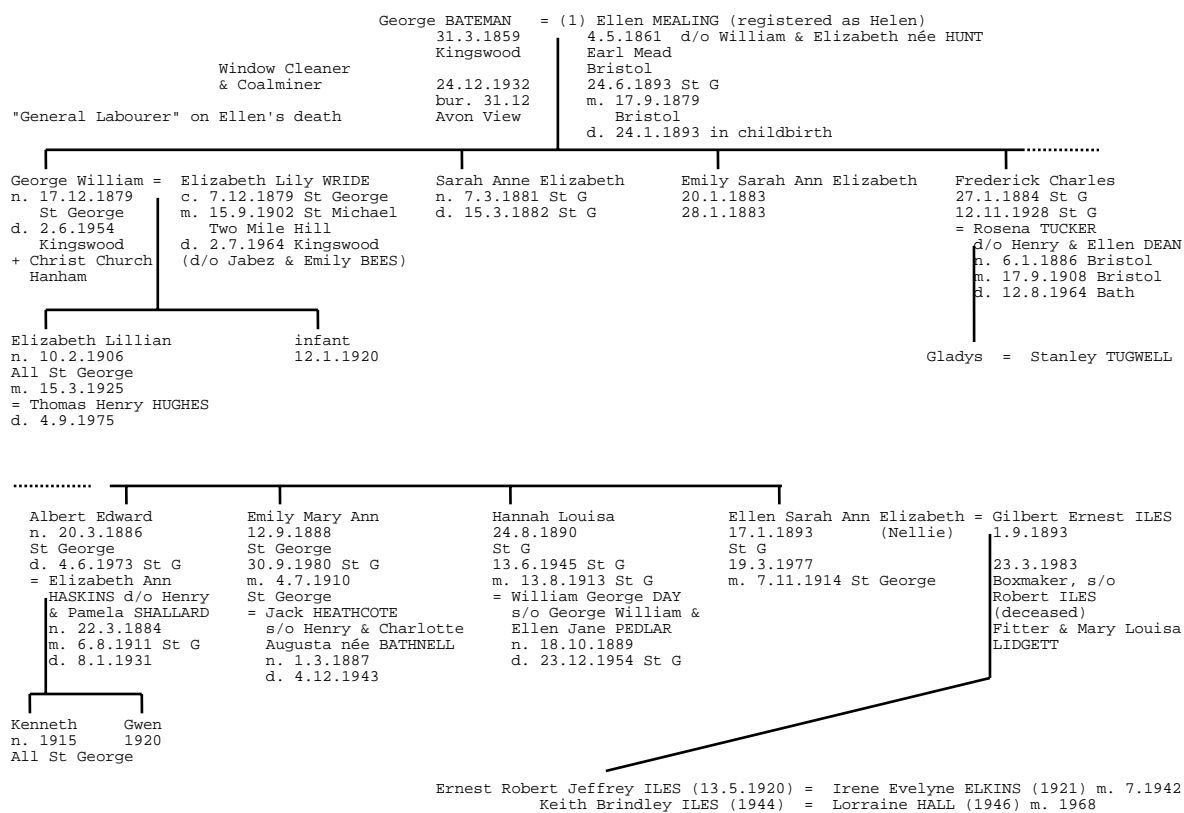

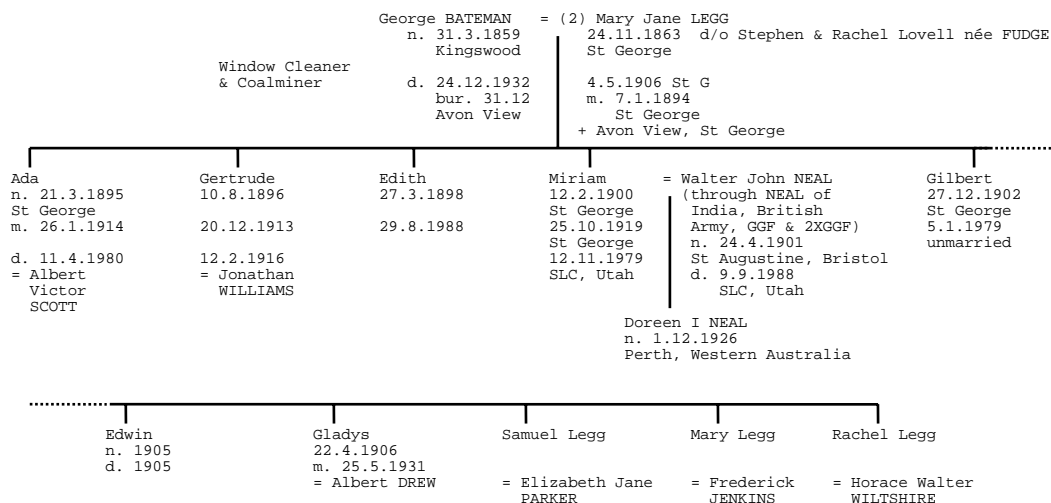
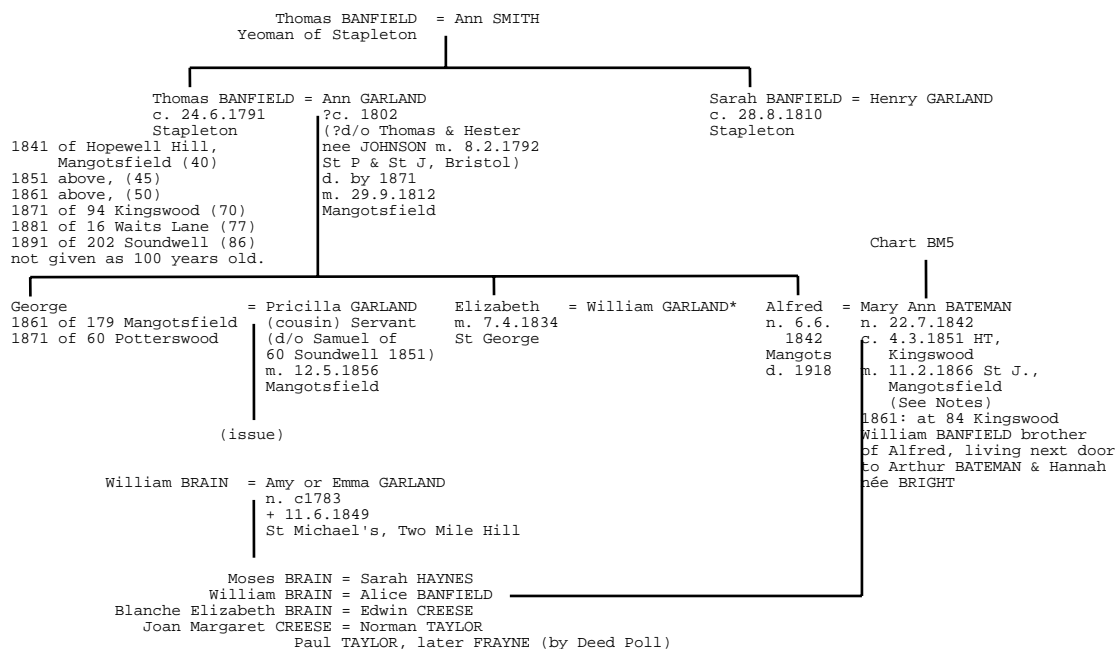


CHART BM6: Bitton/Stapleton BANFIELD/GARLAND/BATEMAN Connections [FRAYNE]

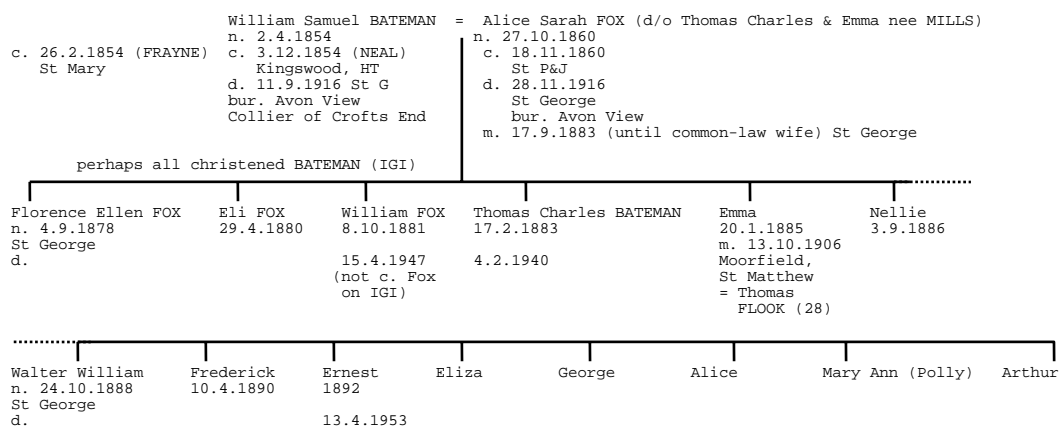

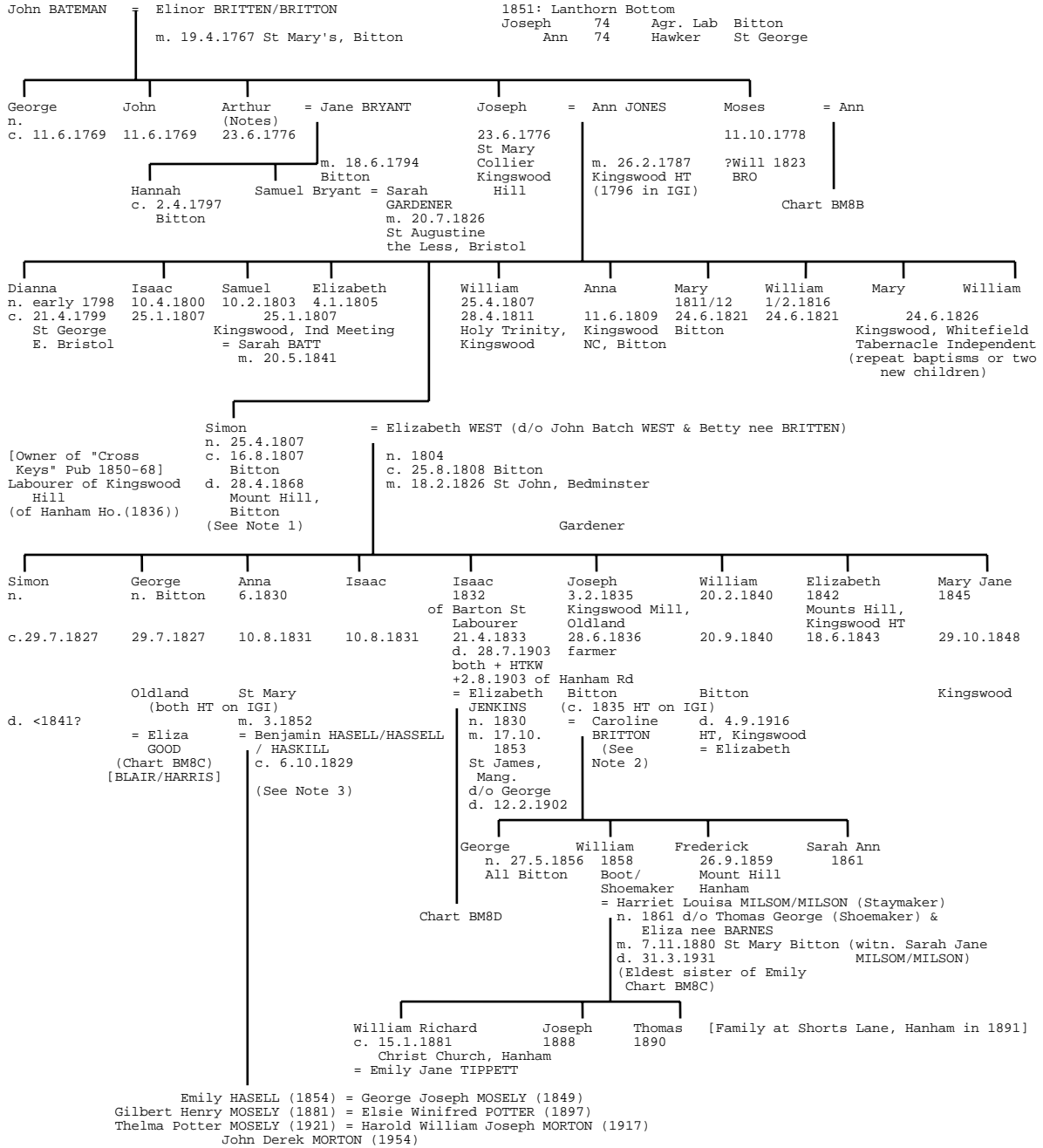

Firstly I desire that all my past debts and funeral and testamentary expenses be paid and satisfied by my Executors herein after named as soon as convenient may be after my decease and secondly I give and bequeath unto my good and faithful servant Simon BATEMAN and unto his heirs for ever all my real estate namely the house garden and field called Weeks Place now in the occupation of Francis WILLIAMS as tenant situate in the aforesaid hamlet parish and county also a house and garden with their appurtenances now in the occupation of Sampson FUDGE as tenant situate Mount Hill hamlet parish and county aforesaid likewise a house and garden with their appurtenances now in the occupation of James FUDGE as tenant situate at Mount Hill hamlet parish and county aforesaid also a house and garden with their appurtenances now in the occupation of Richard situate at Mount Hill hamlet parish and county aforesaid likewise the house I now occupy together with the barn stable with yard garden and all appurtenances also a piece of land at Caddy Moor containing about one acre and two rods likewise a piece of land near Daniel PETTYGROAVES containing nearly five acres the whole situate in the hamlet parish and county aforesaid also if I am possessed of any real estate not before mentioned or should my heirs be entitles to any estate after my decease I give bequeath and devise the same unto my faithful servant Simon BATEMAN and unto his heirs for ever and I hereby desire that no part of the aforesaid estates shall ever be mortgaged. Likewise I give and bequeath unto my faithful servant Simon BATEMAN all my household furniture lien and wearing apparel books plates pictures china horses carts wagons and carriages and also all and every sums of money which may be in my house or be about my person or owed to me at the time of my decease and also all other my stock funds and securities for money book debts money on notes or other securities and all and every other my estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever both real and personal whether in possession reversion or expectancy but although I have given the whole of estate and effects to Simon BATEMAN it is on this condition that the said Simon BATEMAN or heirs in case of his decease pay out of the estates and effects unto my faithful servant Ann Smith the sum of 50 Pounds within six calendar months after my decease on condition that she continues to be my servant until my decease also he the said Simon BATEMAN or his heirs in case of his decease shall pay unto my beloved wife Mary the sum of 12/- weekly during the term of her natural life also her funeral expenses likewise the said Simon BATEMAN or his heirs in case of his decease unto my sister Hester WILLIAMS the sum of 5/- weekly to at my wife's decease and to during the time of my sisters life also my will is that my wife Mary may if she desires reside in either of those houses which is now in the several occupations of Sampson FUDGE, James FUDGE and Richard C. at Mount Hill free of all rent and rates during the term of her natural life and should the said Simon BATEMAN or his heirs at any time neglect to pay such legacies I have charged him with then I empower my other executor or his heirs or assigns to the of the said Simon BATEMAN or upon his as maybe for payments of such legacies or annuities so unpaid and I hereby an appoint Mr Henry STONE of Kingswood Hill and servant Simon BATEMAN to be my 1st Executor of this my Will revoking all previous Wills and Testaments by me made. I declare this only to be my last witness whereof I have set my hand and seal.

And trust to receive the rents and profits of my said real estate with the power to let and generally manage the same and to possessed of such rent and profits until they shall with the interest arising therefrom amount to the sum of One hundred and thirty pounds when I direct my said Trustees or the survivor of them or the executors or administrators of such survivor to pay the same and all interest due in respect thereof to John May MUNRO or his executors administrators or assigns in satisfaction of the Mortgage which he now has on my said real estate for that amount And from and immediately after payment and satisfaction thereof I devise the House and Garden situate at Mount Hill aforesaid in the occupation of Joseph JOHNSON and also the piece of Ground at Cattimore called Harris's in the said Parish of Bitton in my own occupation and containing about one acre and a half unto my said Son Isaac absolutely. I devise the Cottage and Garden and piece of Ground adjoining called Weeks's situate near the Queens Head near Hanham in the said Parish of Bitton and now in the occupation of Joseph JENKINS to my Son Joseph absolutely. I devise the House Garden and piece of land adjoining situate at Mounthill aforesaid in my own occupation to my Son George absolutely. I devise the Cottage and Garden situate aforesaid in the occupation of William HOPES together with half an acre of land on the eastward part of a piece of land called Monks's situate near the Clay Pool in the said Parish of Bitton unto my Daughter Mary Jane STONE absolutely. I devise the remaining part of the said piece of land called Monks's and containing four acres and a half unto and equally between my Daughter Elizabeth CROWE and her Son William absolutely as tenants in common. I devise the Cottage and Garden situate at Mounthill aforesaid in the occupation of Thomas BRITTON unto my said Wife for her life and from and after her decease I devise the same unto my Grandchild George HAZELL absolutely. And I appoint the said George BURNELL and my said Son George Executors of this my Will. I declare that the Trustees or Trustee for the time being of my Will shall be responsible only for their of his own respective acts defaults and receipts and be exempt from liability for involuntary losses and be at liberty to deduct and allow to each other all expenses incident to the execution of the trust of my Will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this twenty second day of April One thousand eight hundred and sixty eight

Acknowledged delivery of copies of undertaking 3rd November 1853 and 17th October 1891. Executed George BATEMAN and attested.

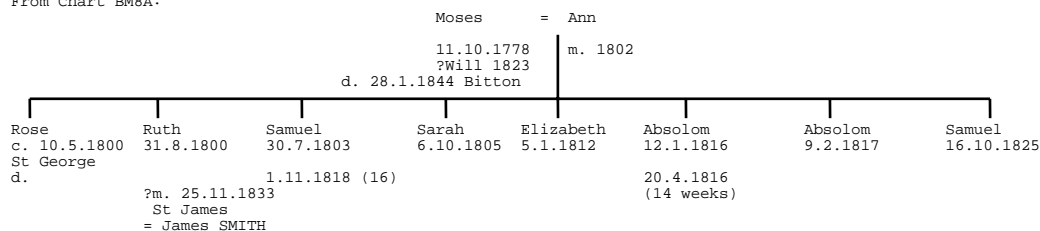
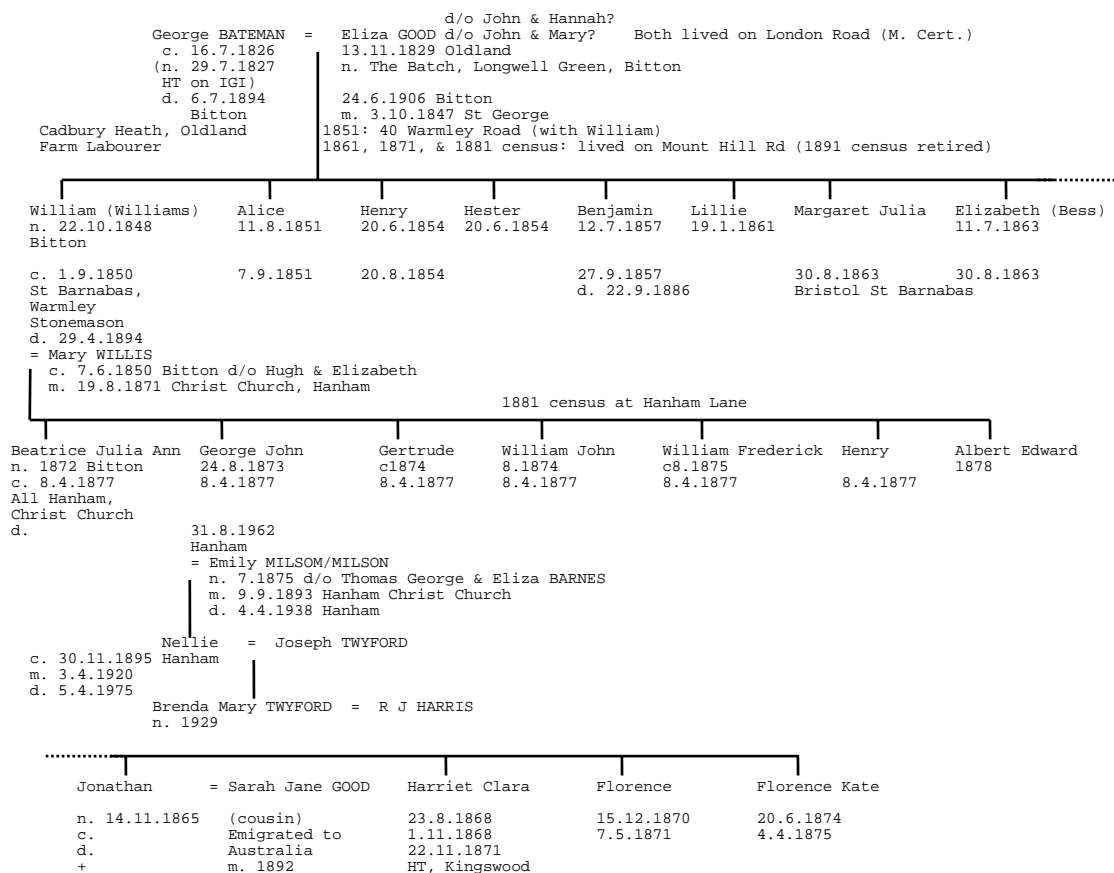


CHART EM8C: Descendants of George BATEMAN & Elizabeth GOOD [BLAIR/HARRIS]

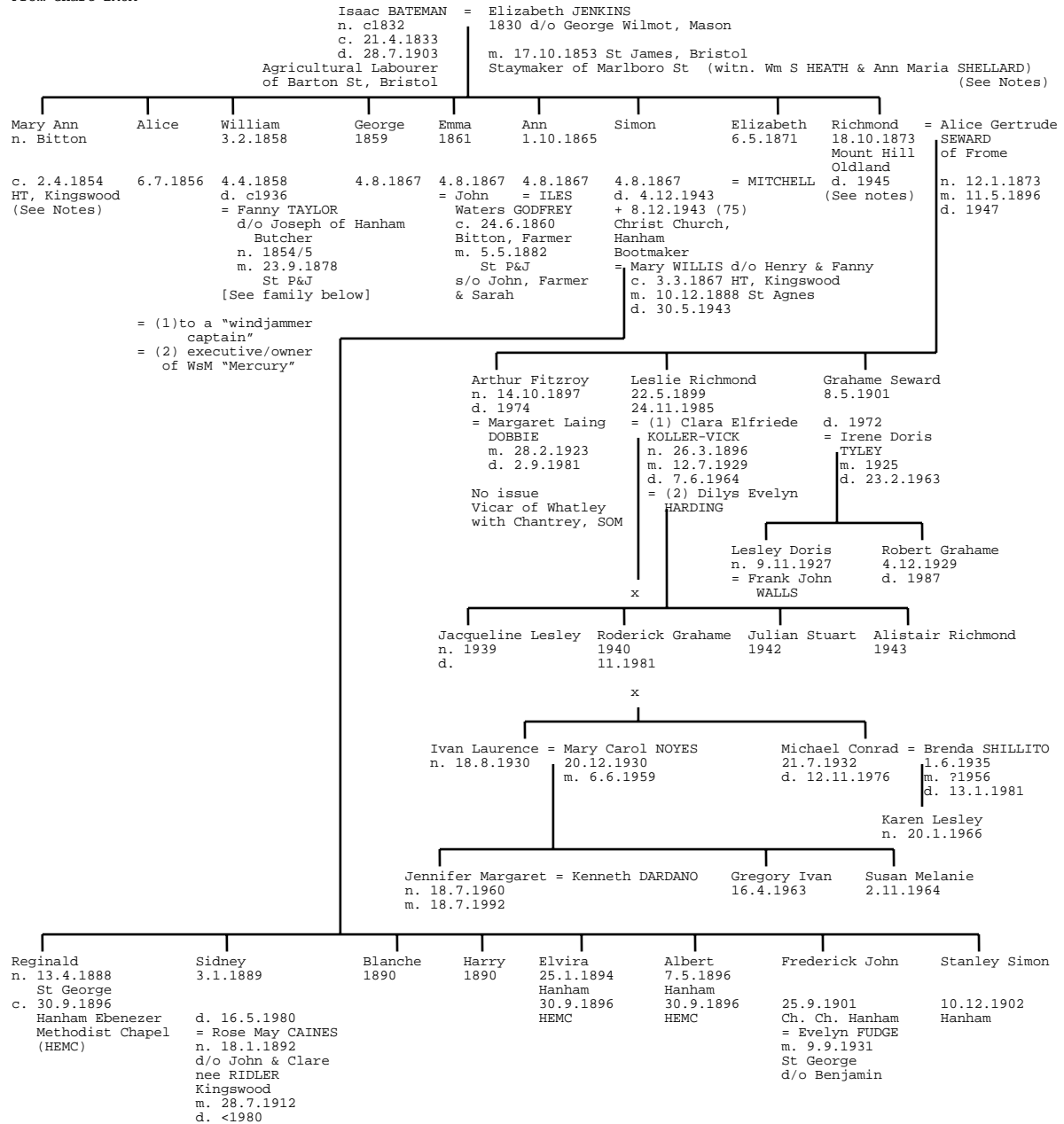

William BATEMAN sold his business to his younger brother Richmond, who is also listed in the same census at 96 High Street, Staple Hill as a butcher. William moved to another house in the same street. Richmond's butcher shop with adjoining home and stockyard at 96 High Street, Staple Hill was taken on soon after marriage in 1896. His son Grahame then carried on the business at least until the 1950's. It is no longer a butcher shop but the elaborate ironwork of the front was still evident in 1998.

William lived at the Greyhound Hotel in Broadmead, Bristol. The hotel was run by his daughter Kitty as licensee and her sister Daisy. Kitty (never married) was the licensee at the "Greyhound" Hotel on Broadmead from 1931 to at least 1944. The hotel has been closed for many years but its historic facade has been preserved as the entrance to the Broadmead shopping centre.

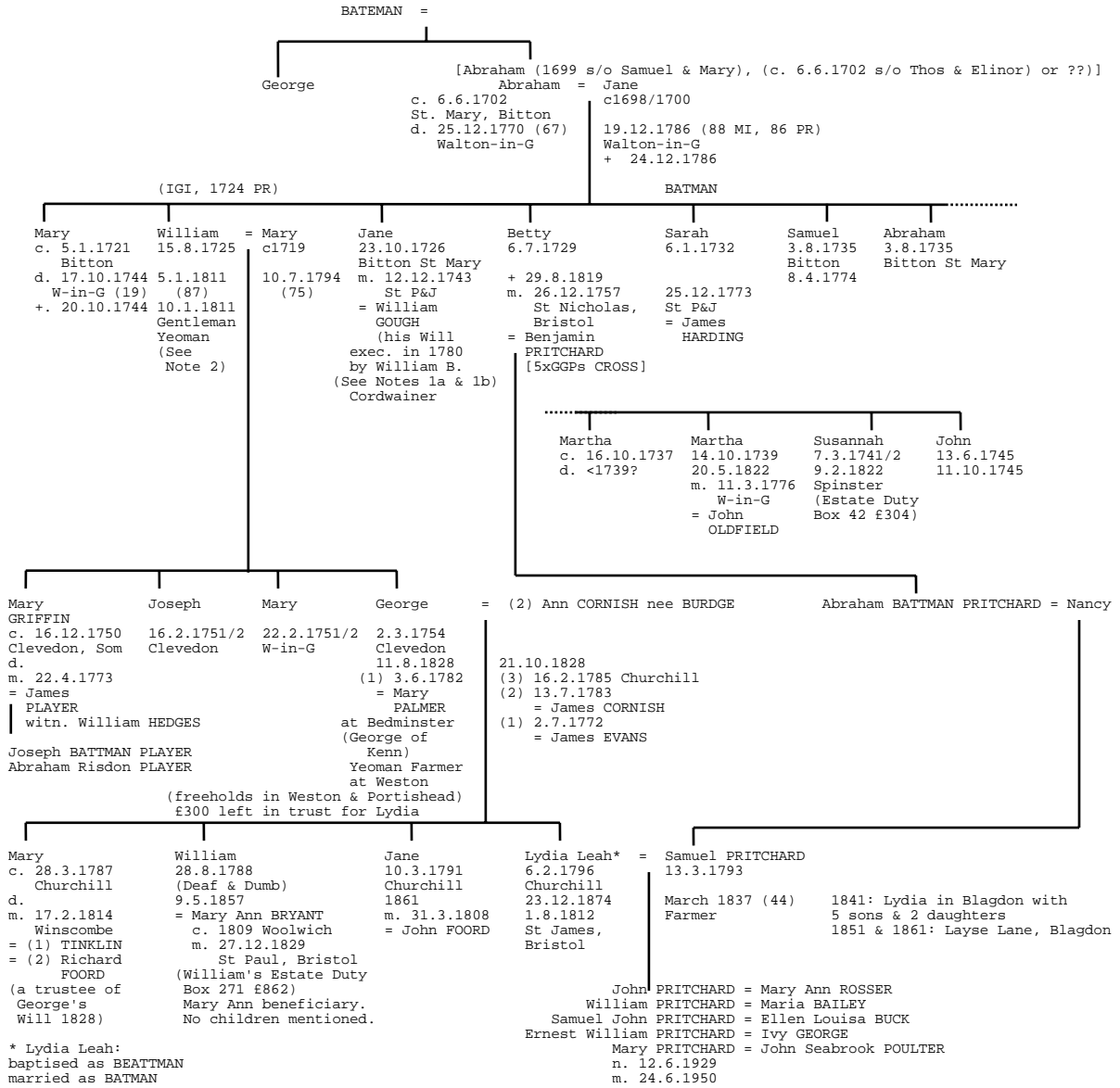

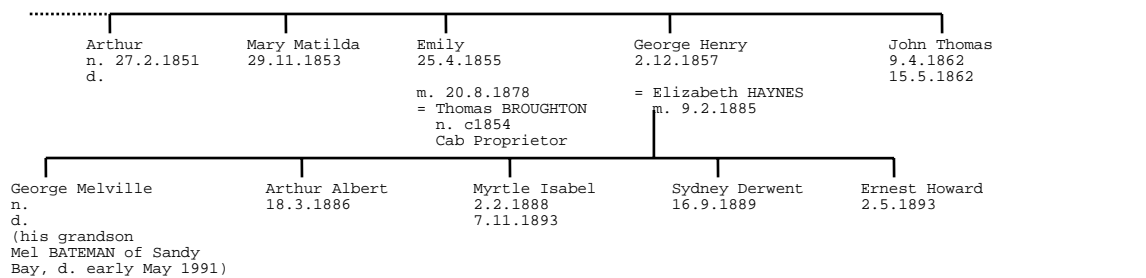
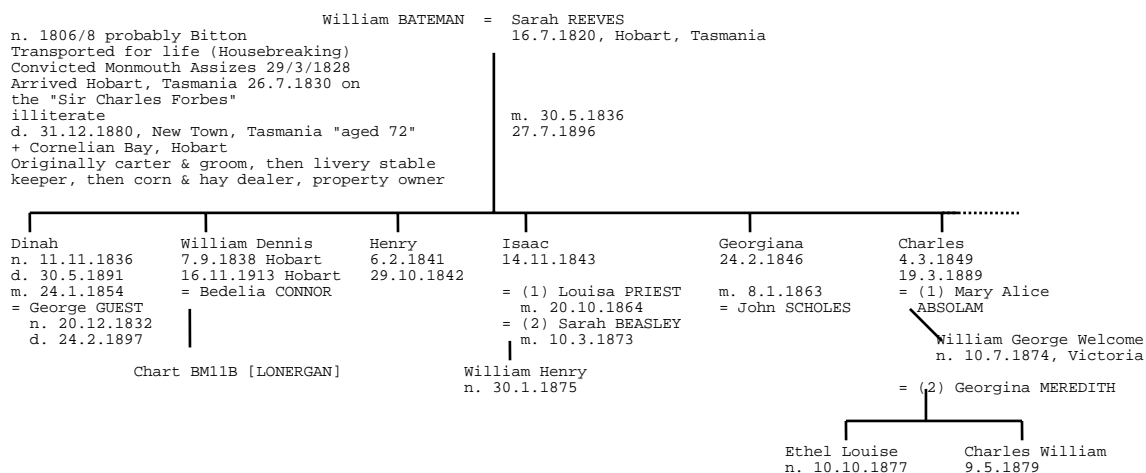


CHART BM11B: Descendants of William Dennis BATEMAN & Bedelia CONNOR - A Possible Australian Connection Continued [LONERGAN]

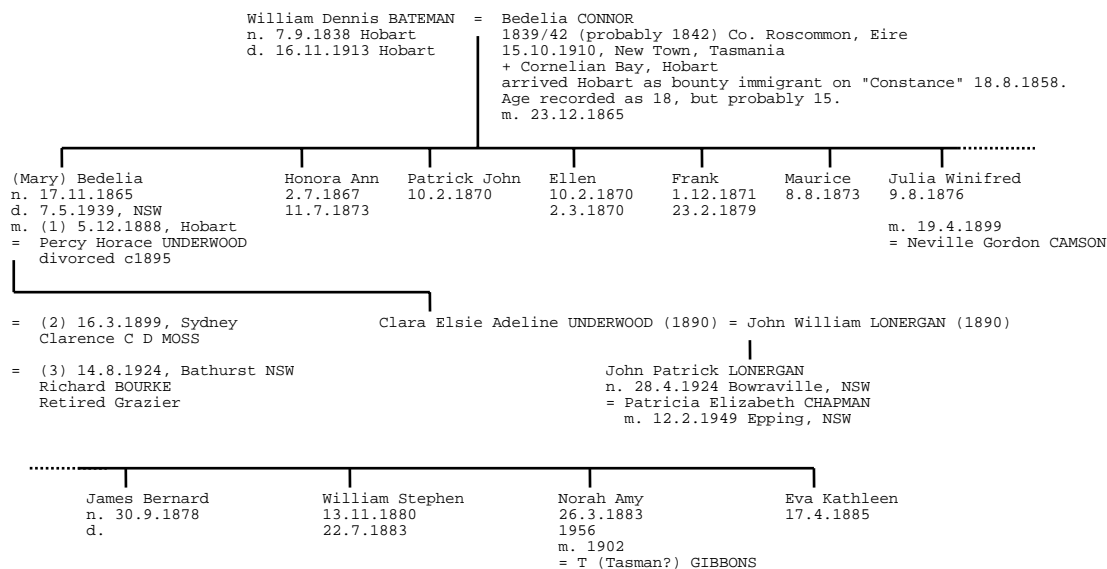
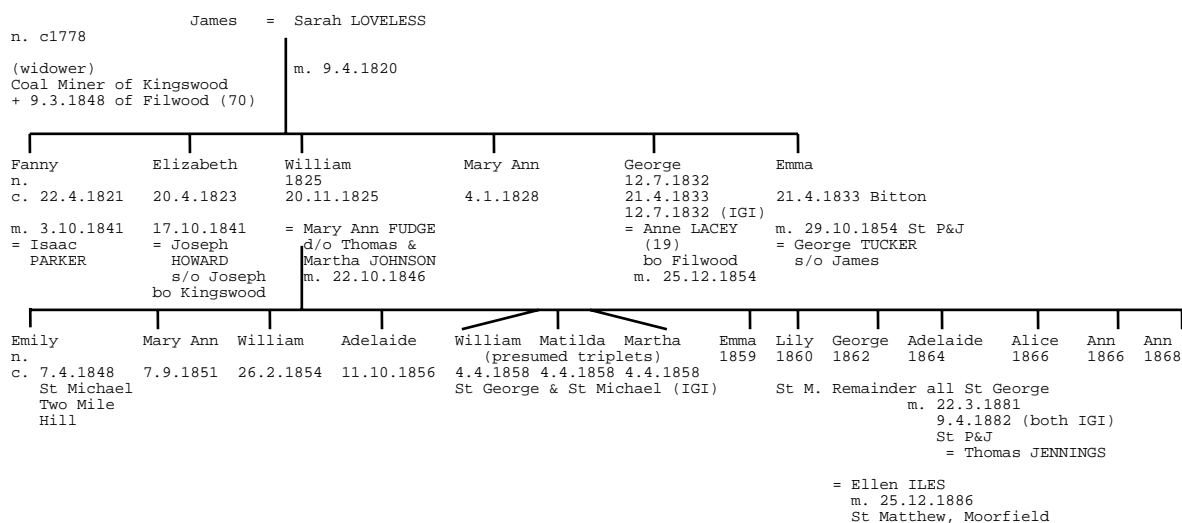


CHART BM12: Descendants of James BATEMAN & Sarah LOVELESS [POOLE]

Will of Abraham BATEMAN, Yeoman of Wick & Abson (10/10/1820)

I Abraham BATEMAN of the parish of Wick & Abson in the County of Gloucester Yeoman give the following instructions for my last Will and Testament and desire the same to be taken as and for my last Will and Testament until a more formal Testament shall be prepared or in default of the same.
 I give and bequeath all and singular my farming stock household goods implements of husbandry and all other my goods and chattels credits securities monies and other effects to my wife Anna BATEMAN to hold to her the said Anna BATEMAN her executors administrators and assigns as her and their own property. And I hereby utterly revoke all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made and appoint my said wife sole executrix of this my Will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said Abraham BATEMAN have to this my said Will and Testament affixed my hand and seal this tenth day of October in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty.

"Diverse sorts of suspected goods were found upon CAYNES, BATMAN, JONES and GANE, a catalogue of which is intended to be made public." After sentencing Elizabeth JONES was spared the gallows, but was burnt in the hand as punishment. She returned home 26.4.1727 where the Bitton Poor Law paid her 2s 6d to look after 2 of her grandchildren orphaned by judicial murder, William's wife Mary received 1s 9d for nursing CAYNES's youngest child which later died on 4.8.1729

William BATEMAN, Carpenter; his workshop in Bitton destroyed by fire with working tools, chairs, table, bedsteads, mahogany, etc. to £50 upwards. BATEMAN an industrious young man who was working by candlelight escaped with his life (Felix Farley's Bristol Journal 7.2.1795)
