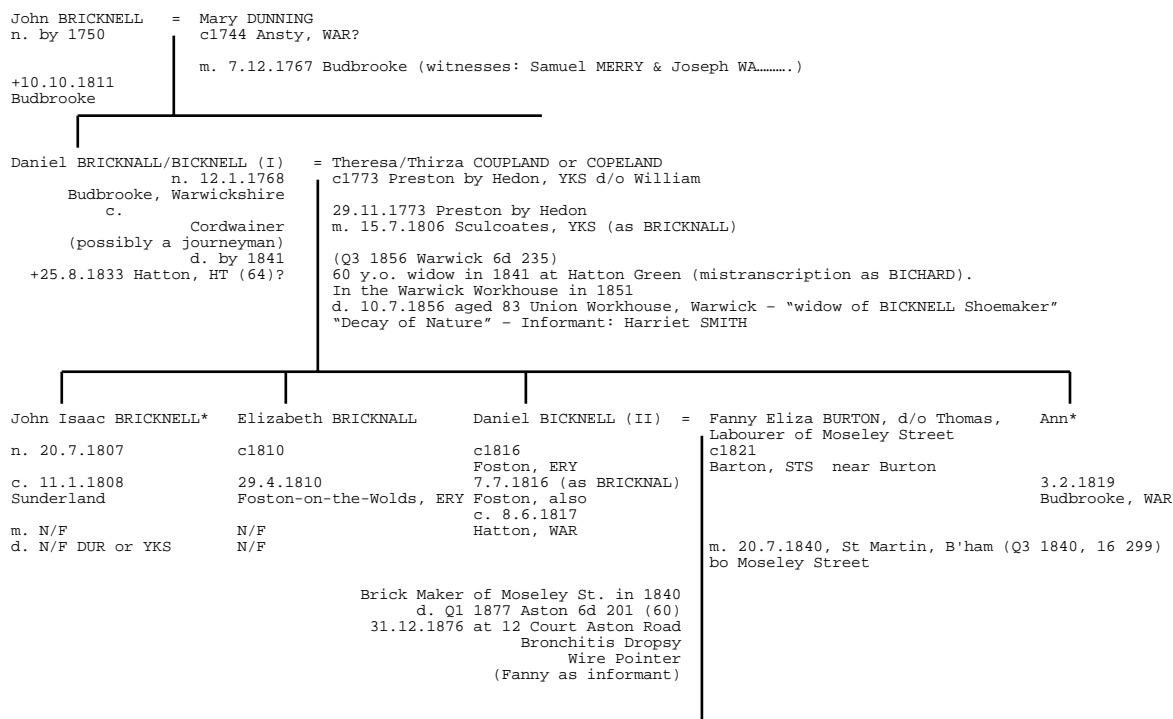

\* Durham BTs: "John Isaac BICKNELL born 20<sup>th</sup> July 1807 baptised 11<sup>th</sup> January 1808 s/o Daniel BRICKNALL, Cordwainer of Budbrooke, Warwickshire by Thirza COPELAND of Foston, Yorkshire."

Notes

- Daniel rebaptism is recorded mother as "BRICKNELL late COPELING". Unclear why Elizabeth, but most likely should be "BICKNELL late COPELAND". Father Daniel confirmed as cordwainer.
- Ann BICKNELS 3.2.1819 d/o Daniel BICKNELS & Elizabeth COPLING, based on above is most likely this same couple, and therefore Theresa's last child at age 46.
- Unknown BICKNELLS in village: George BICKNELL (Gentleman) = Alicia KENDALL m. 17.5.1821 Budbrooke  
 Georgina Maria BICKNELL (10) +24.5.1834, Budbrooke (church vault).  
 Family lived in Berkeley Square & Cadogan Place, Chelsea, London. A man of wealth and unlikely connected to this family.
- Elizabeth BICKNELL (60) +20.4.1836, Cubbington St. Mary
- Trade directories in Foston 1830-1865 - no refs., for any Daniel.

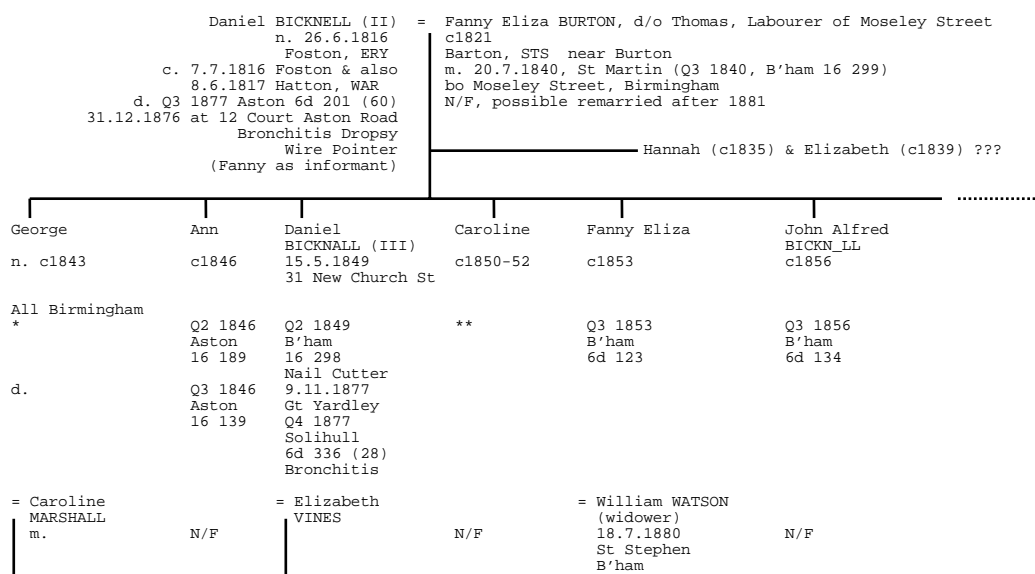

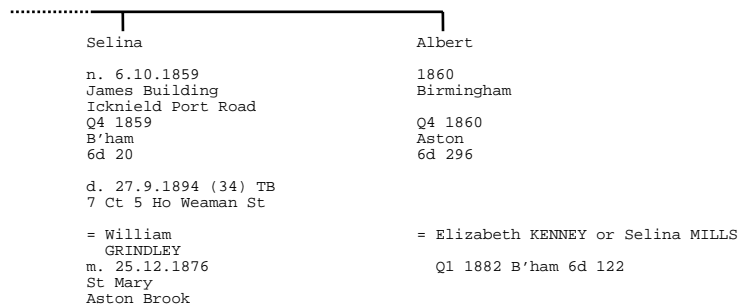

Census Data

1. Daniel & Fanny Eliza:

1841: probably the record in B'ham St. Martin - Bordesley Street  
Daniel BICKNELL (25), Faney (20), with Hannah (6), Elizabeth (2) - all not in county with George BARTON (Labourer, 60) & Hannah BARTON (22). Probably Fanny's father & sister.

Ages match the couple if Toney=Fanny as mistranscription. No births for children found, but dead by 1851. Ages are wrong. If Fanny married pregnant or had given birth prior to marriage, then it is possible one child is 1 year and the other a few months at census time. Whole of 1841 census checked for surname variants, and this is the most likely answer.

1851: 4 Snowhill Wharf, Birmingham St. Mary (between Snow Hill & Slaney St.)

Daniel (34) - Engine Driver, Fanny (29) - domestic, George (7), Ann (4), Daniel (1)

1861: Heneage Street in Aston/Duddeston

Daniel (44), Fanny (40), George (19), Ann (15), Caroline (15\*), Daniel (12), Eliza (6), John A (4), Selina (1), Alfred (3m)  
[\*BMD has no evidence of twins so Caroline assumed after Daniel - range 8 to 11]

1871: in Duddeston

Daniel (54), Fanny (50), John Alfred (14) - whereabouts of other family members (deaths, marriages or other returns) to be clarified

1881: Fanny (61), a widow, a Laundress of Barton, Staffs living with WATSON family:

1891: Fanny E. BICKNELL (or variants) N/F

Witnesses: Henry ELLIS & Selina GRINDLEY (her sister)

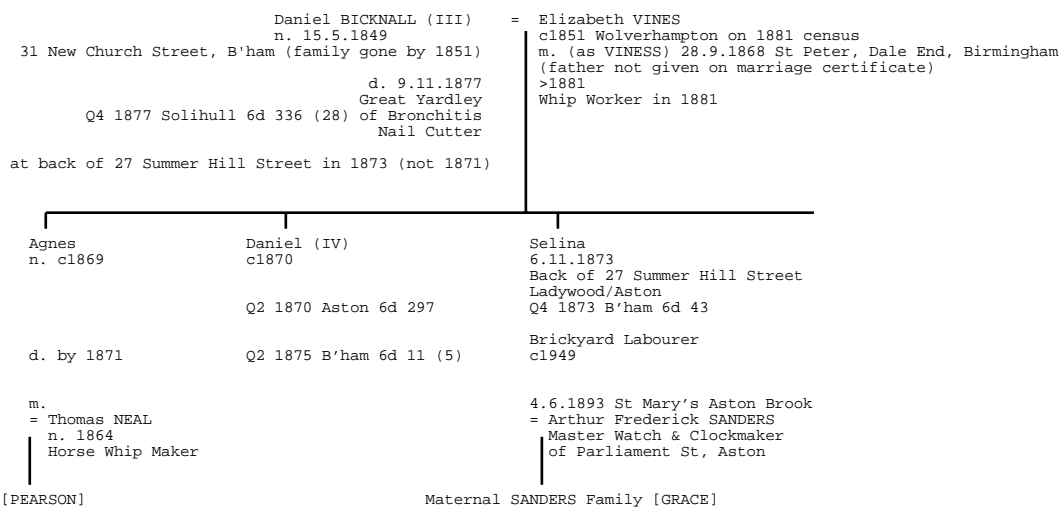

Census Data

Daniel & Elizabeth:

In 1871: Ladywood (James Buildings, same place as Selina was born in 1859)  
Daniel (31\*), Elizabeth (20), Agnes (2), Daniel (1) and also visitor Charles SMITH (18)  
\* Age should be 21. Charles SMITH is possibly her half-brother after her mother married.

In 1881:

Elizabeth widowed (30) at 35 Aston Rd, Aston given as d/o John (60) & Ann S. SMITH (53, her mother Ann Sophia formerly VINES)  
with only surviving child Selina (7).

In 1891 Aston Manor:

Selina (17) in house of John SMITH of Osenby, LIN (30, incorrect age) as granddaughter, with Lawrgher (sic) WALL (13) given as sister to head. John's age should be 70 and the "sister" is unknown - age likely to be wrong also.

possible BICKNELL (or SANDERS) cousin with Arthur & Selina in 1901 at Parliament St.  
William ROTHERS (sic) actually ROTHERO aged 15, cousin

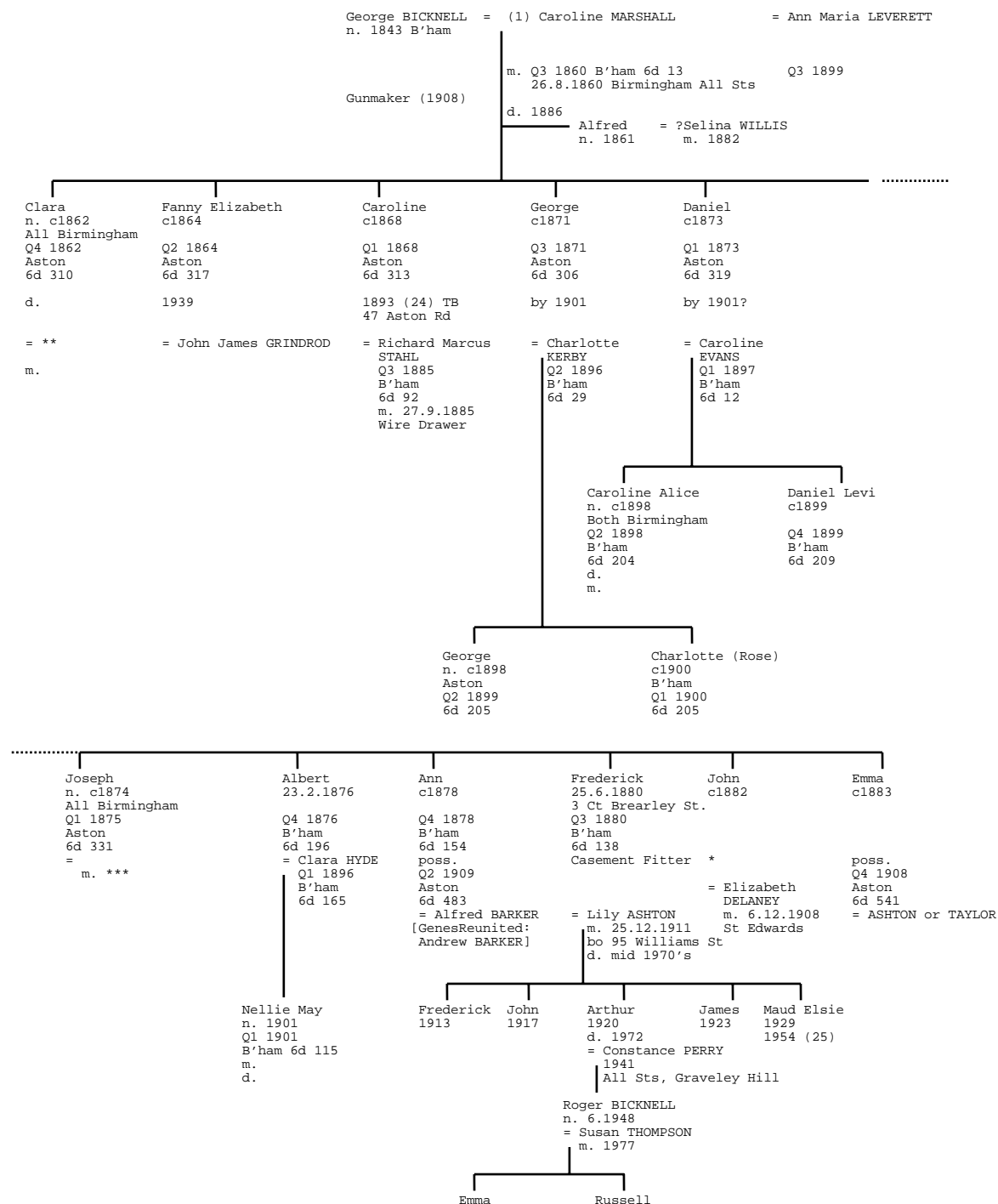

Children of Fred & Lily (to be confirmed):  
 Fred married unknown, possibly 2 children and living in Redditch area.  
 John married Gladys and lived in Hawthorn Road, Kingstanding. Son John perhaps living in Jersey?  
 James married unknown in mid 1970's, but died a few years later from a heart attack. Lived opposite Aston Villa FC.

GenesReunited contacts: Gillian GRAHAM & Dave KEMP - Fanny Elizabeth & John James GRINDROD.

Albert (1876) to Clara of Villa Street Aston, father William Francis HYDE. 1911 census at 95 Williams St, with 2 surviving children of 5 - daughter Nellie (10) & son Leslie (6). At same address in the 1920 electoral register.

George & Caroline:

In 1881: 3 Back 47 Brearley Street

George (37) - Gun Screwer, Caroline (36) - Domestic, Clara (19) - Pearl Button Driller, Fanny Elizabeth (16) - Pearl Button Carder, Caroline (13), George (11), Daniel (8), Joseph (7), Albert (4), Ann (3), Frederick (few months)

In 1891 B'ham St George:

George (47), Albert (16), Ann (12), Frederick (10), John (8), Emma (7) with housekeeper Louisa RODGERS (46)

In 1901 ???

\* John - May have m. Q1 1899 Aston 6d 352 = Hannah HAYNES or Agnes Eliza WILKINS, but a John BICKNELL from B'ham of correct age is present at the Garrison in Colchester. A John of right age, with father George, joined the Bedfordshire Regiment in August 1900. He has a medal/decoration for the South African Campaign, and may have served in India & the East Indies. He leaves the full-time army and becomes part of the reserves in 1908. After his 1908 marriage to Elizabeth DELANEY he is resident 1 Bk 90 New John Street West. Called back to active service on 11.9.1914 and posted to France next day, but home again 19.12.1914.

\*\* Clara - Possible marriage as BAGNALL Aston Q3 1881 6d 553 to Henry GRADY or John Robert GRANTHAM

\*\*\* Joseph - Possible marriage as BAGNALL Q3 1898 B'ham 6d 304

Albert & Clara:

In 1901 in Birmingham St George as BICKINTO (sic):

Albert (24), Clara (22), Nellie May (3 months)

Daniel & Caroline:

In 1901 at home of Henry G. & Eliza EVANS, Caroline BICKNELL (25) - daughter, Caroline (3), & Daniel L (1) - grandchildren  
Location of Daniel senior, not clear

George & Charlotte:

In 1901, Charlotte given as Head (25), with George (2) & Charlotte (1), plus niece Beatrice BUDDER (7).

Frederick aka Frank BICKNELL (1880) joined the Gloucestershire Regiment in December 1900, and was in Ceylon & India until 1908. Went into reserves and called back to the Labour Corp in 1914. His older brother George was given as next of kin in "K. R. Rifle Corp." and Alfred in the Liverpool Regiment.
